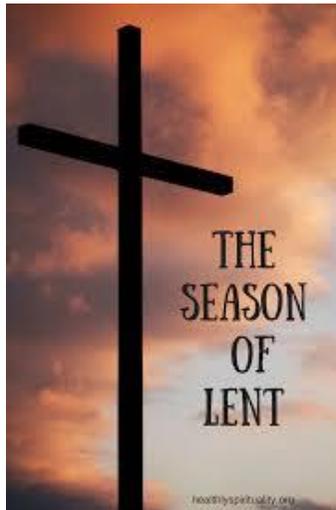


# A JOURNEY OF THE HEART

***FROM ASH WEDNESDAY TO HOLY SATURDAY***

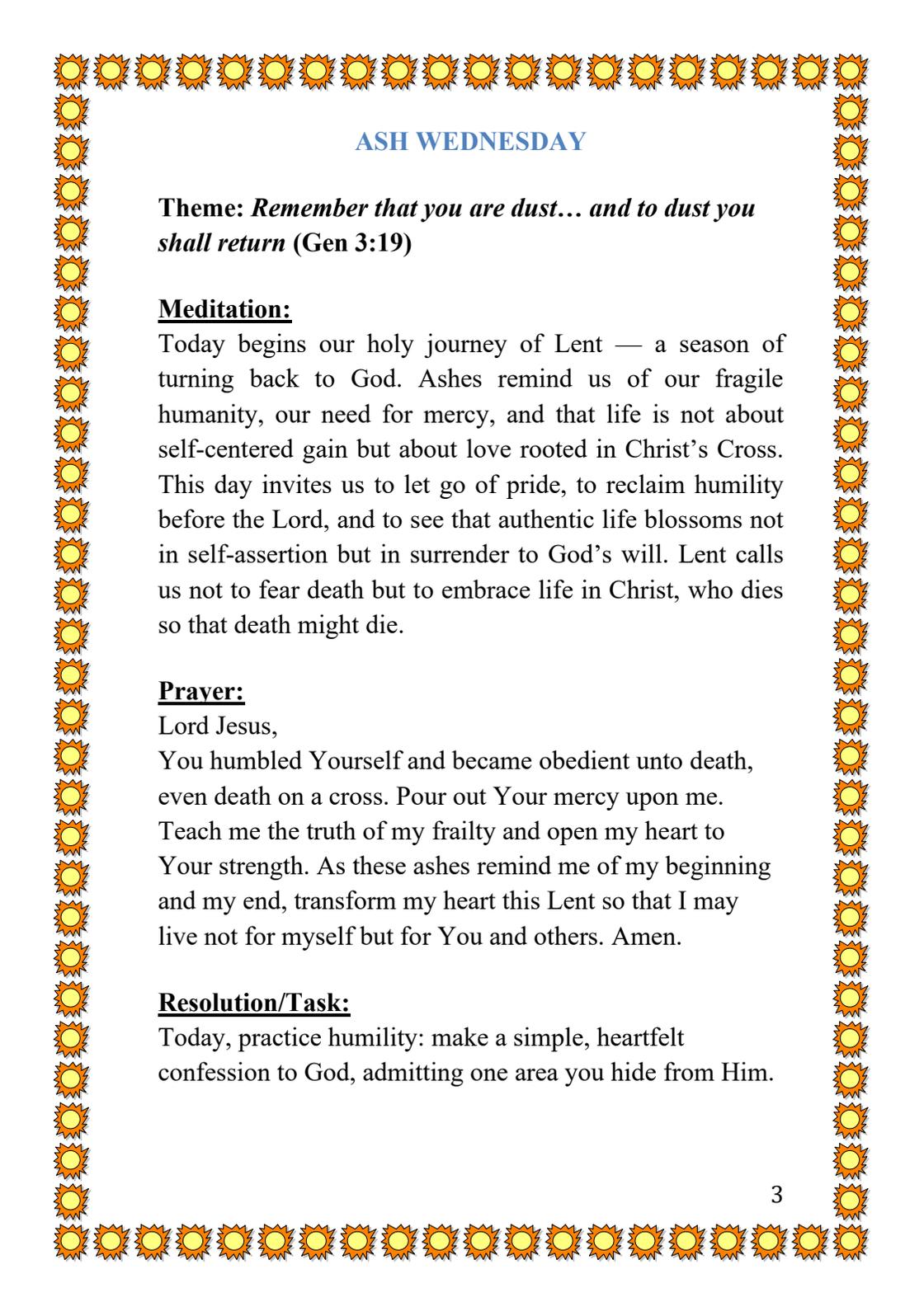
## INTRODUCTION TO LENT

The **Season of Lent** is a time of preparation for **Easter**, focusing on **prayer, fasting, and repentance**. In **Church Year A**, the readings highlight Jesus' **temptation in the desert, His teachings, and His transfiguration**, guiding us to **turn away from sin and grow closer to God**.

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday**, reminding us of our need for **conversion and humility**. Over forty days, we are called to **reflect, pray, and practice self-discipline**, preparing our hearts to celebrate **Christ's death and resurrection**.

Lent is not just about giving up things; it is a **journey of the heart** — to be transformed by God's love and to live more fully as His disciples.





## ASH WEDNESDAY

**Theme:** *Remember that you are dust... and to dust you shall return (Gen 3:19)*

**Meditation:**

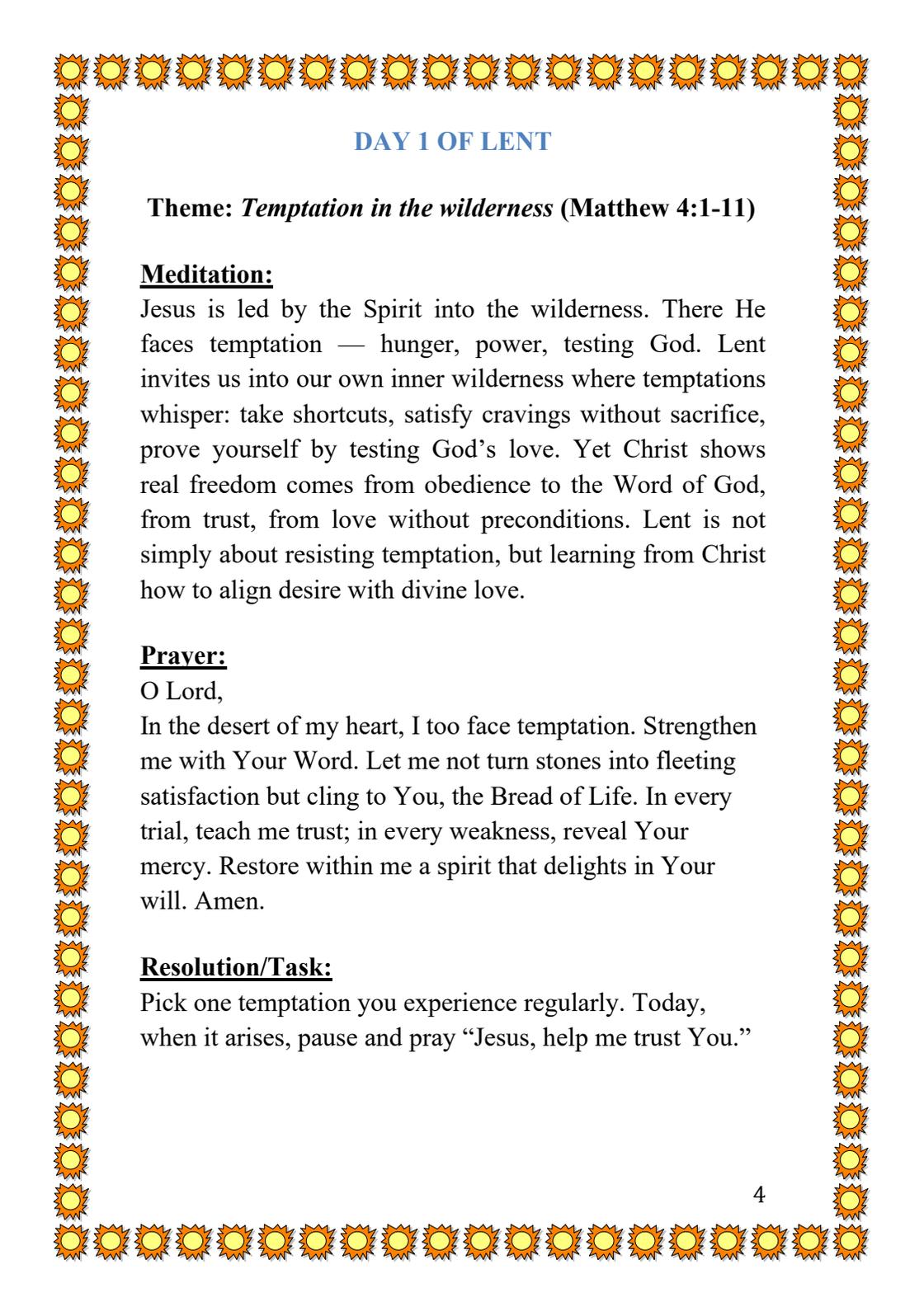
Today begins our holy journey of Lent — a season of turning back to God. Ashes remind us of our fragile humanity, our need for mercy, and that life is not about self-centered gain but about love rooted in Christ’s Cross. This day invites us to let go of pride, to reclaim humility before the Lord, and to see that authentic life blossoms not in self-assertion but in surrender to God’s will. Lent calls us not to fear death but to embrace life in Christ, who dies so that death might die.

**Prayer:**

Lord Jesus,  
You humbled Yourself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Pour out Your mercy upon me. Teach me the truth of my frailty and open my heart to Your strength. As these ashes remind me of my beginning and my end, transform my heart this Lent so that I may live not for myself but for You and others. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Today, practice humility: make a simple, heartfelt confession to God, admitting one area you hide from Him.



## DAY 1 OF LENT

**Theme:** *Temptation in the wilderness* (Matthew 4:1-11)

**Meditation:**

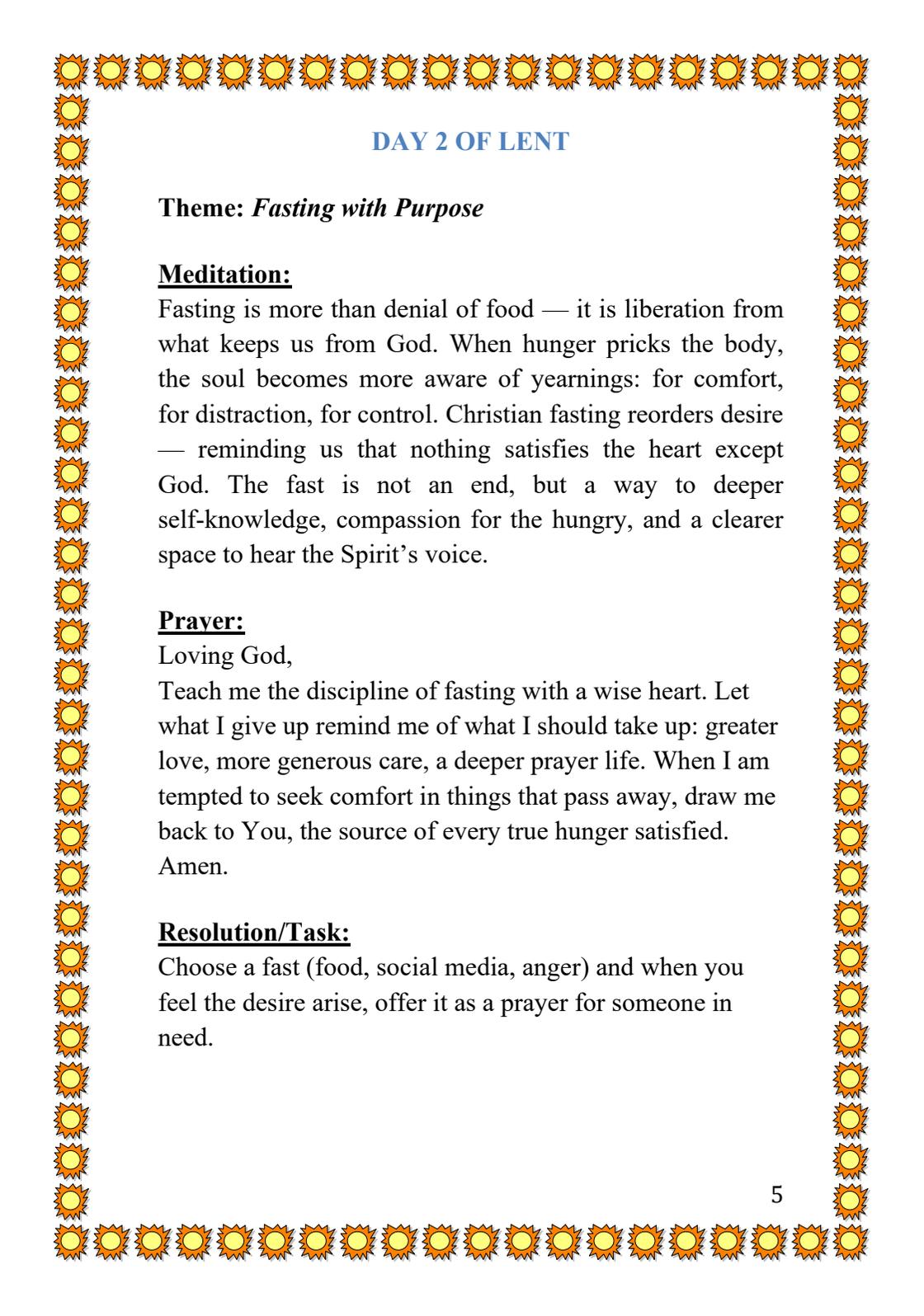
Jesus is led by the Spirit into the wilderness. There He faces temptation — hunger, power, testing God. Lent invites us into our own inner wilderness where temptations whisper: take shortcuts, satisfy cravings without sacrifice, prove yourself by testing God’s love. Yet Christ shows real freedom comes from obedience to the Word of God, from trust, from love without preconditions. Lent is not simply about resisting temptation, but learning from Christ how to align desire with divine love.

**Prayer:**

O Lord,  
In the desert of my heart, I too face temptation. Strengthen me with Your Word. Let me not turn stones into fleeting satisfaction but cling to You, the Bread of Life. In every trial, teach me trust; in every weakness, reveal Your mercy. Restore within me a spirit that delights in Your will. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Pick one temptation you experience regularly. Today, when it arises, pause and pray “Jesus, help me trust You.”



## DAY 2 OF LENT

**Theme:** *Fasting with Purpose*

**Meditation:**

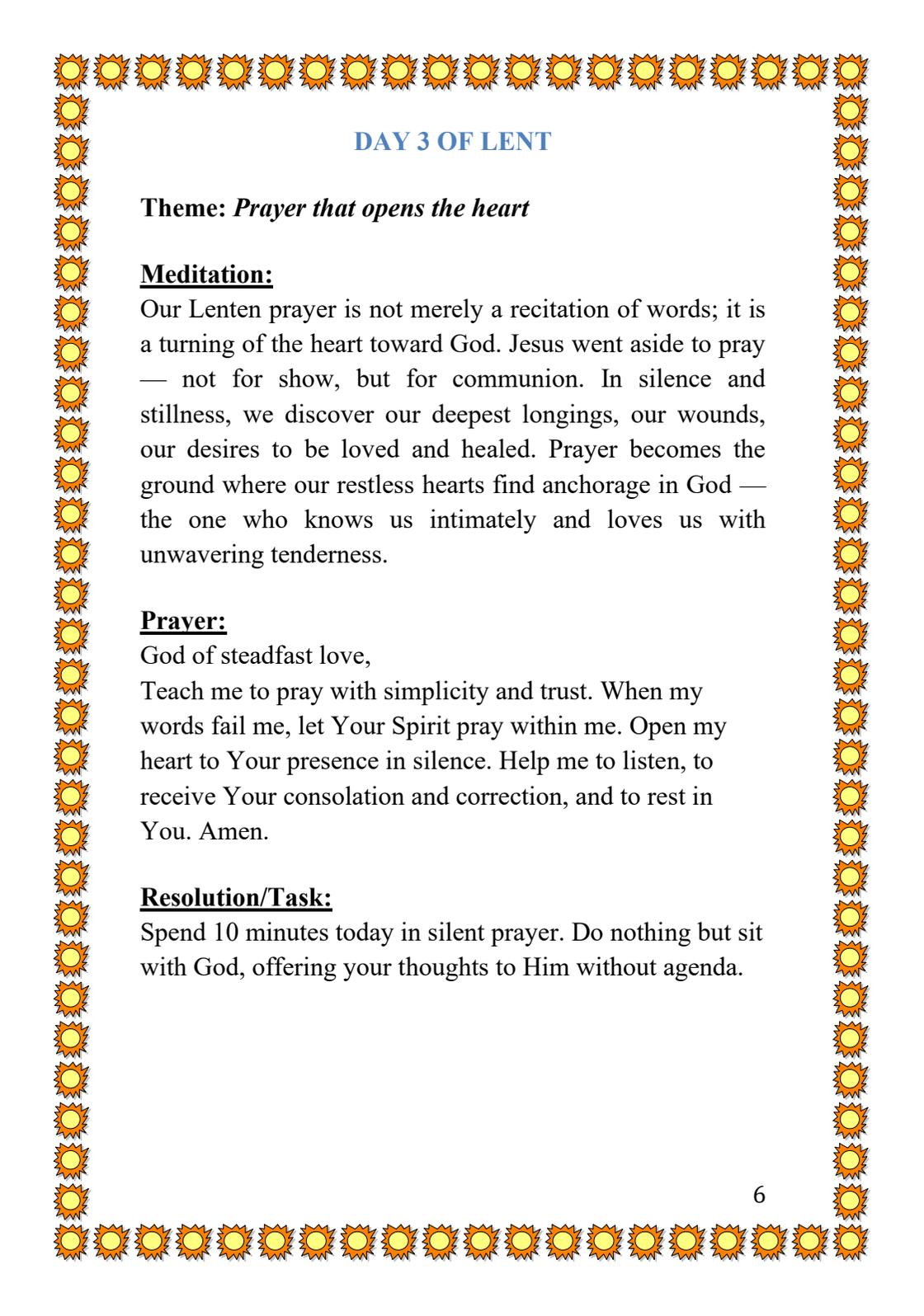
Fasting is more than denial of food — it is liberation from what keeps us from God. When hunger pricks the body, the soul becomes more aware of yearnings: for comfort, for distraction, for control. Christian fasting reorders desire — reminding us that nothing satisfies the heart except God. The fast is not an end, but a way to deeper self-knowledge, compassion for the hungry, and a clearer space to hear the Spirit’s voice.

**Prayer:**

Loving God,  
Teach me the discipline of fasting with a wise heart. Let what I give up remind me of what I should take up: greater love, more generous care, a deeper prayer life. When I am tempted to seek comfort in things that pass away, draw me back to You, the source of every true hunger satisfied.  
Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Choose a fast (food, social media, anger) and when you feel the desire arise, offer it as a prayer for someone in need.



## DAY 3 OF LENT

**Theme:** *Prayer that opens the heart*

**Meditation:**

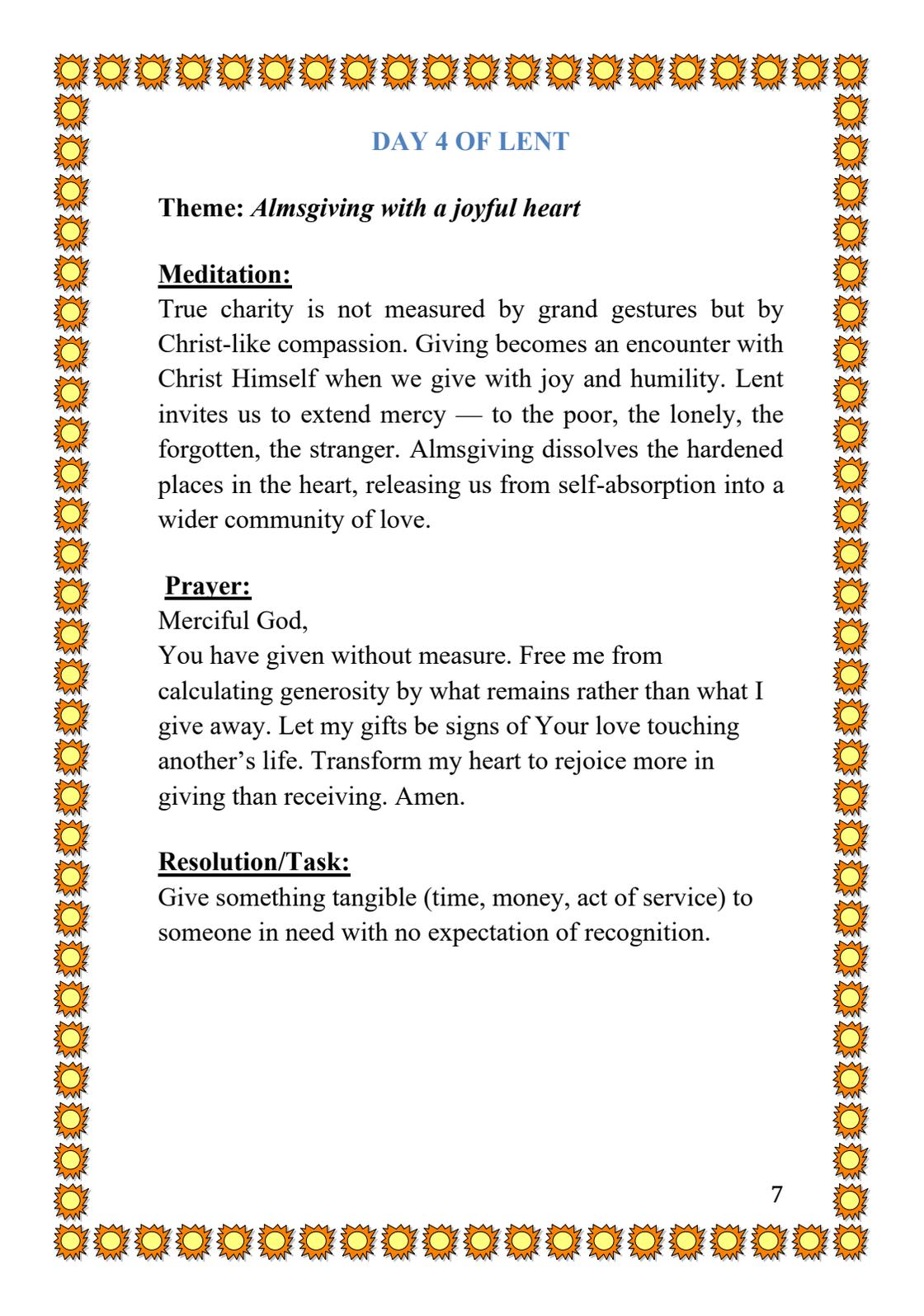
Our Lenten prayer is not merely a recitation of words; it is a turning of the heart toward God. Jesus went aside to pray — not for show, but for communion. In silence and stillness, we discover our deepest longings, our wounds, our desires to be loved and healed. Prayer becomes the ground where our restless hearts find anchorage in God — the one who knows us intimately and loves us with unwavering tenderness.

**Prayer:**

God of steadfast love,  
Teach me to pray with simplicity and trust. When my words fail me, let Your Spirit pray within me. Open my heart to Your presence in silence. Help me to listen, to receive Your consolation and correction, and to rest in You. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Spend 10 minutes today in silent prayer. Do nothing but sit with God, offering your thoughts to Him without agenda.



## DAY 4 OF LENT

**Theme:** *Almsgiving with a joyful heart*

**Meditation:**

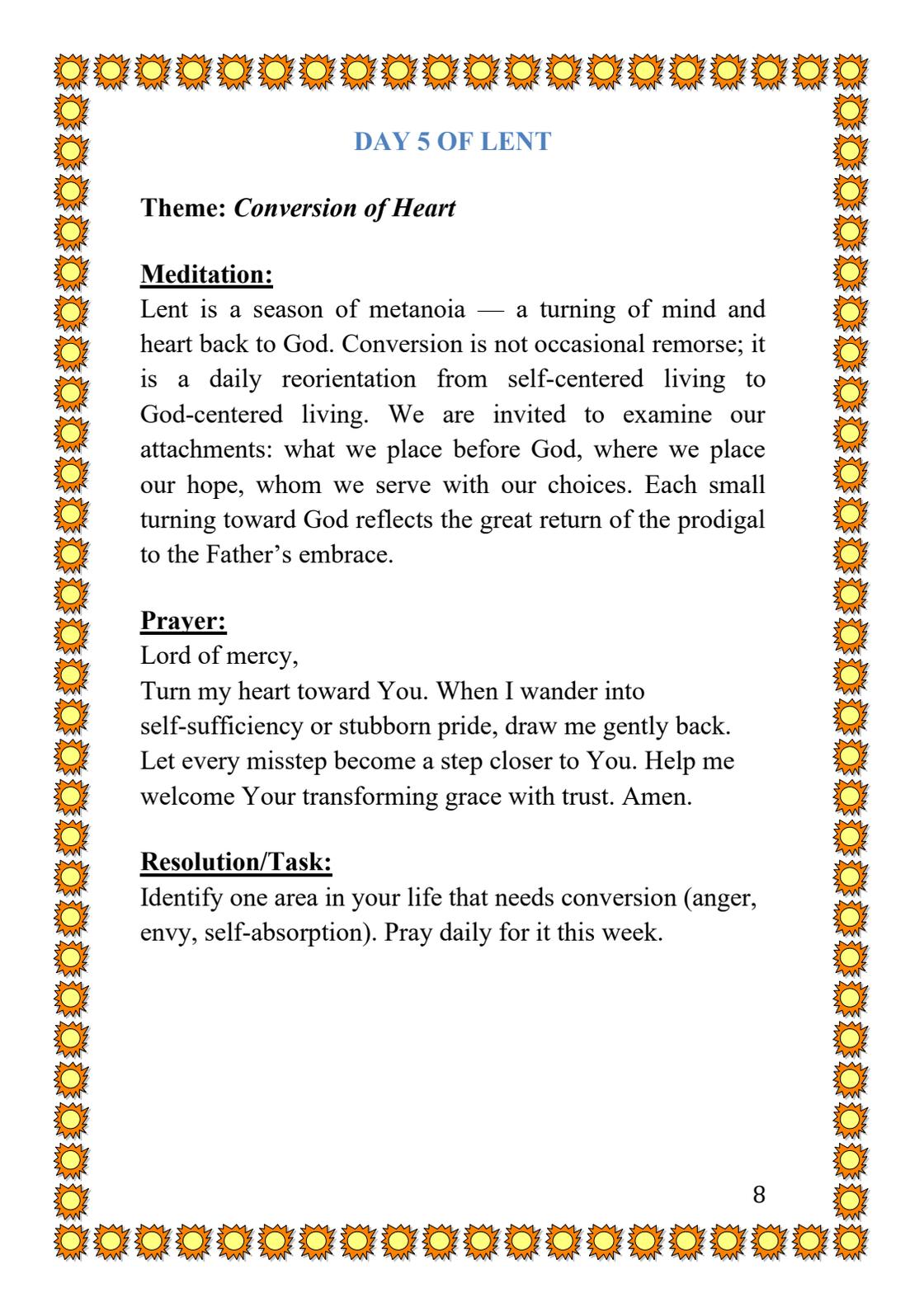
True charity is not measured by grand gestures but by Christ-like compassion. Giving becomes an encounter with Christ Himself when we give with joy and humility. Lent invites us to extend mercy — to the poor, the lonely, the forgotten, the stranger. Almsgiving dissolves the hardened places in the heart, releasing us from self-absorption into a wider community of love.

**Prayer:**

Merciful God,  
You have given without measure. Free me from calculating generosity by what remains rather than what I give away. Let my gifts be signs of Your love touching another's life. Transform my heart to rejoice more in giving than receiving. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Give something tangible (time, money, act of service) to someone in need with no expectation of recognition.



## DAY 5 OF LENT

**Theme:** *Conversion of Heart*

**Meditation:**

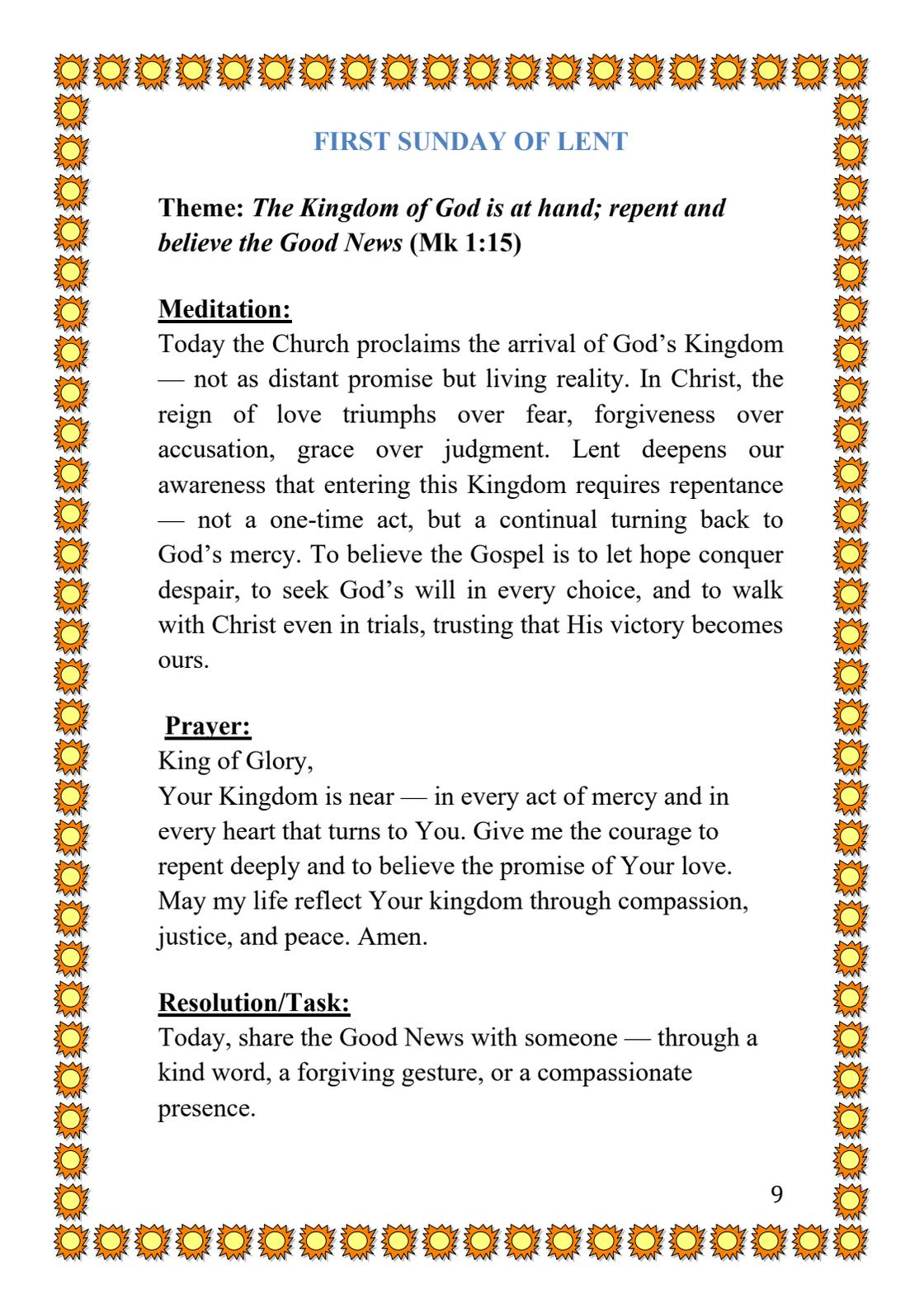
Lent is a season of metanoia — a turning of mind and heart back to God. Conversion is not occasional remorse; it is a daily reorientation from self-centered living to God-centered living. We are invited to examine our attachments: what we place before God, where we place our hope, whom we serve with our choices. Each small turning toward God reflects the great return of the prodigal to the Father's embrace.

**Prayer:**

Lord of mercy,  
Turn my heart toward You. When I wander into self-sufficiency or stubborn pride, draw me gently back. Let every misstep become a step closer to You. Help me welcome Your transforming grace with trust. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Identify one area in your life that needs conversion (anger, envy, self-absorption). Pray daily for it this week.



## FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

**Theme:** *The Kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe the Good News (Mk 1:15)*

**Meditation:**

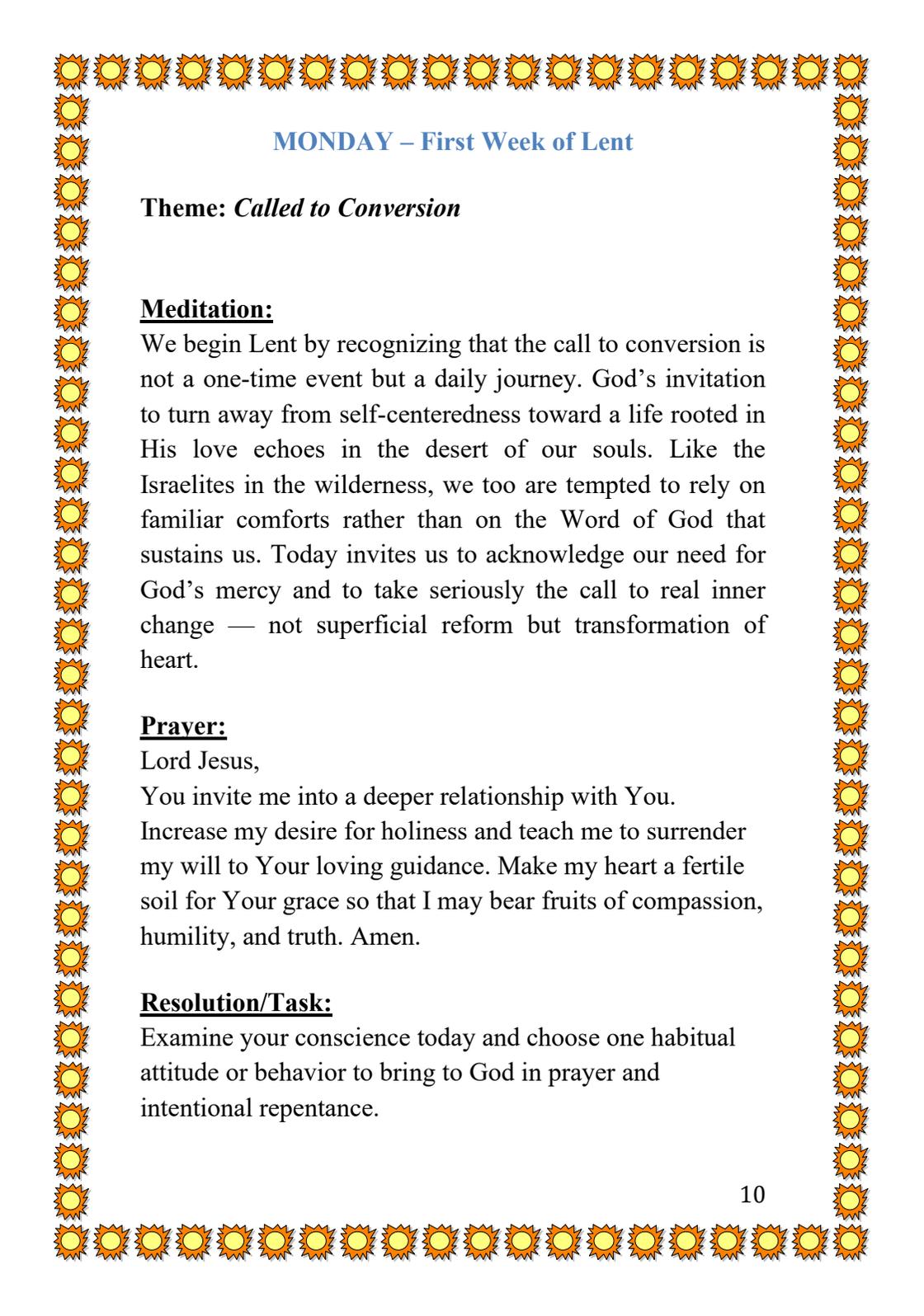
Today the Church proclaims the arrival of God's Kingdom — not as distant promise but living reality. In Christ, the reign of love triumphs over fear, forgiveness over accusation, grace over judgment. Lent deepens our awareness that entering this Kingdom requires repentance — not a one-time act, but a continual turning back to God's mercy. To believe the Gospel is to let hope conquer despair, to seek God's will in every choice, and to walk with Christ even in trials, trusting that His victory becomes ours.

**Prayer:**

King of Glory,  
Your Kingdom is near — in every act of mercy and in every heart that turns to You. Give me the courage to repent deeply and to believe the promise of Your love. May my life reflect Your kingdom through compassion, justice, and peace. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Today, share the Good News with someone — through a kind word, a forgiving gesture, or a compassionate presence.



## MONDAY – First Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Called to Conversion*

**Meditation:**

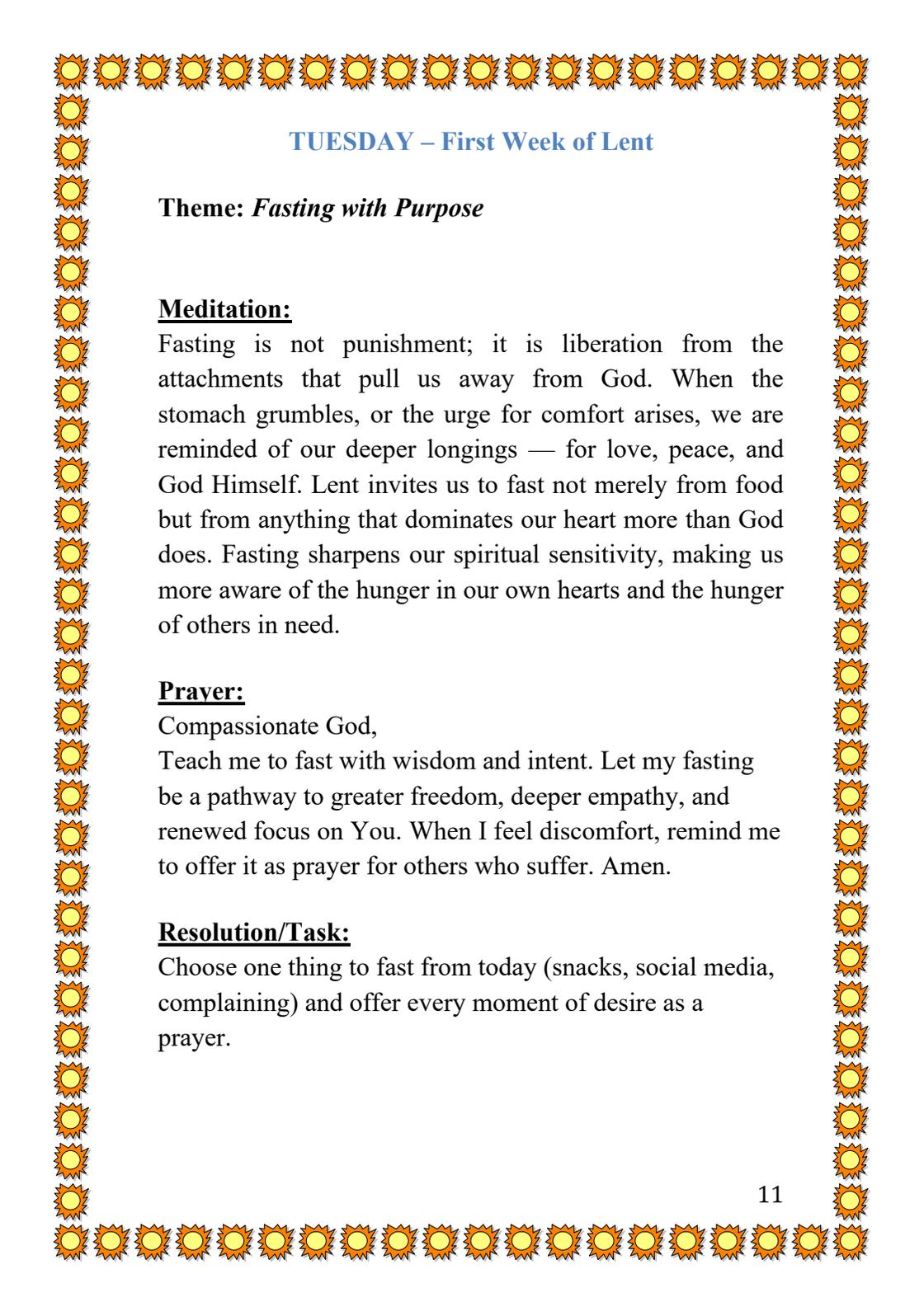
We begin Lent by recognizing that the call to conversion is not a one-time event but a daily journey. God’s invitation to turn away from self-centeredness toward a life rooted in His love echoes in the desert of our souls. Like the Israelites in the wilderness, we too are tempted to rely on familiar comforts rather than on the Word of God that sustains us. Today invites us to acknowledge our need for God’s mercy and to take seriously the call to real inner change — not superficial reform but transformation of heart.

**Prayer:**

Lord Jesus,  
You invite me into a deeper relationship with You.  
Increase my desire for holiness and teach me to surrender my will to Your loving guidance. Make my heart a fertile soil for Your grace so that I may bear fruits of compassion, humility, and truth. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Examine your conscience today and choose one habitual attitude or behavior to bring to God in prayer and intentional repentance.



## TUESDAY – First Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Fasting with Purpose*

**Meditation:**

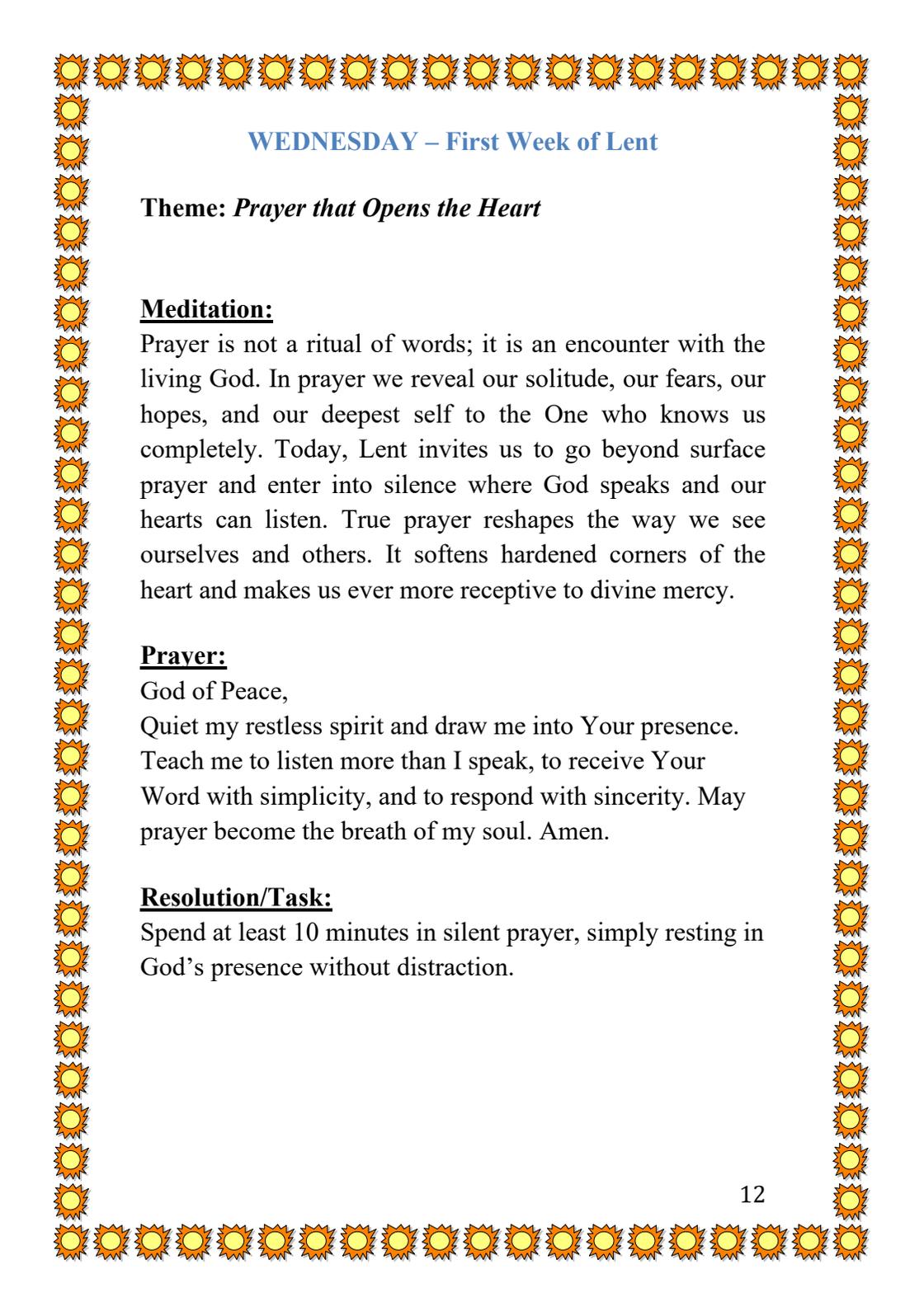
Fasting is not punishment; it is liberation from the attachments that pull us away from God. When the stomach grumbles, or the urge for comfort arises, we are reminded of our deeper longings — for love, peace, and God Himself. Lent invites us to fast not merely from food but from anything that dominates our heart more than God does. Fasting sharpens our spiritual sensitivity, making us more aware of the hunger in our own hearts and the hunger of others in need.

**Prayer:**

Compassionate God,  
Teach me to fast with wisdom and intent. Let my fasting be a pathway to greater freedom, deeper empathy, and renewed focus on You. When I feel discomfort, remind me to offer it as prayer for others who suffer. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Choose one thing to fast from today (snacks, social media, complaining) and offer every moment of desire as a prayer.



## WEDNESDAY – First Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Prayer that Opens the Heart*

**Meditation:**

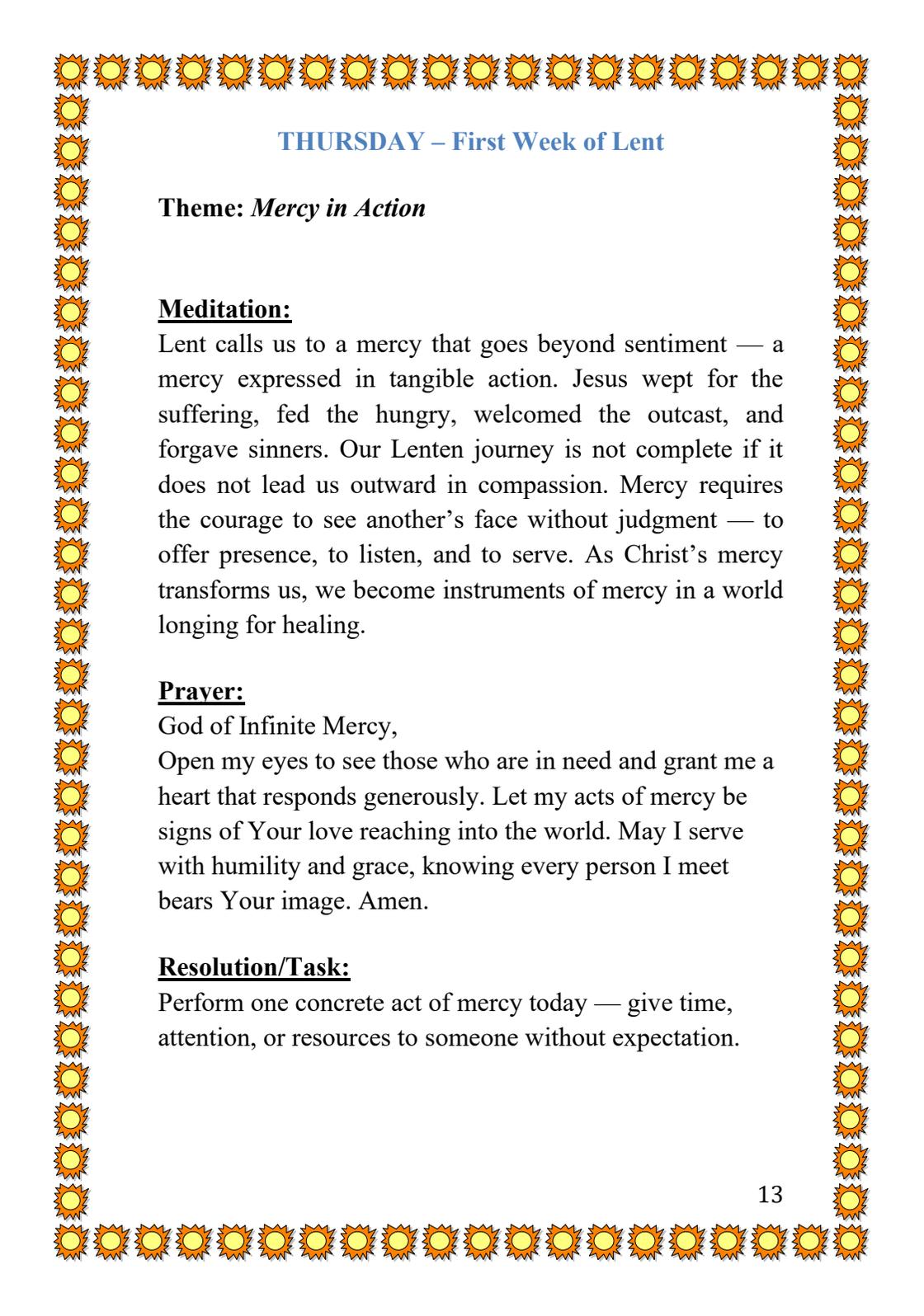
Prayer is not a ritual of words; it is an encounter with the living God. In prayer we reveal our solitude, our fears, our hopes, and our deepest self to the One who knows us completely. Today, Lent invites us to go beyond surface prayer and enter into silence where God speaks and our hearts can listen. True prayer reshapes the way we see ourselves and others. It softens hardened corners of the heart and makes us ever more receptive to divine mercy.

**Prayer:**

God of Peace,  
Quiet my restless spirit and draw me into Your presence.  
Teach me to listen more than I speak, to receive Your  
Word with simplicity, and to respond with sincerity. May  
prayer become the breath of my soul. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Spend at least 10 minutes in silent prayer, simply resting in God's presence without distraction.



## THURSDAY – First Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Mercy in Action*

**Meditation:**

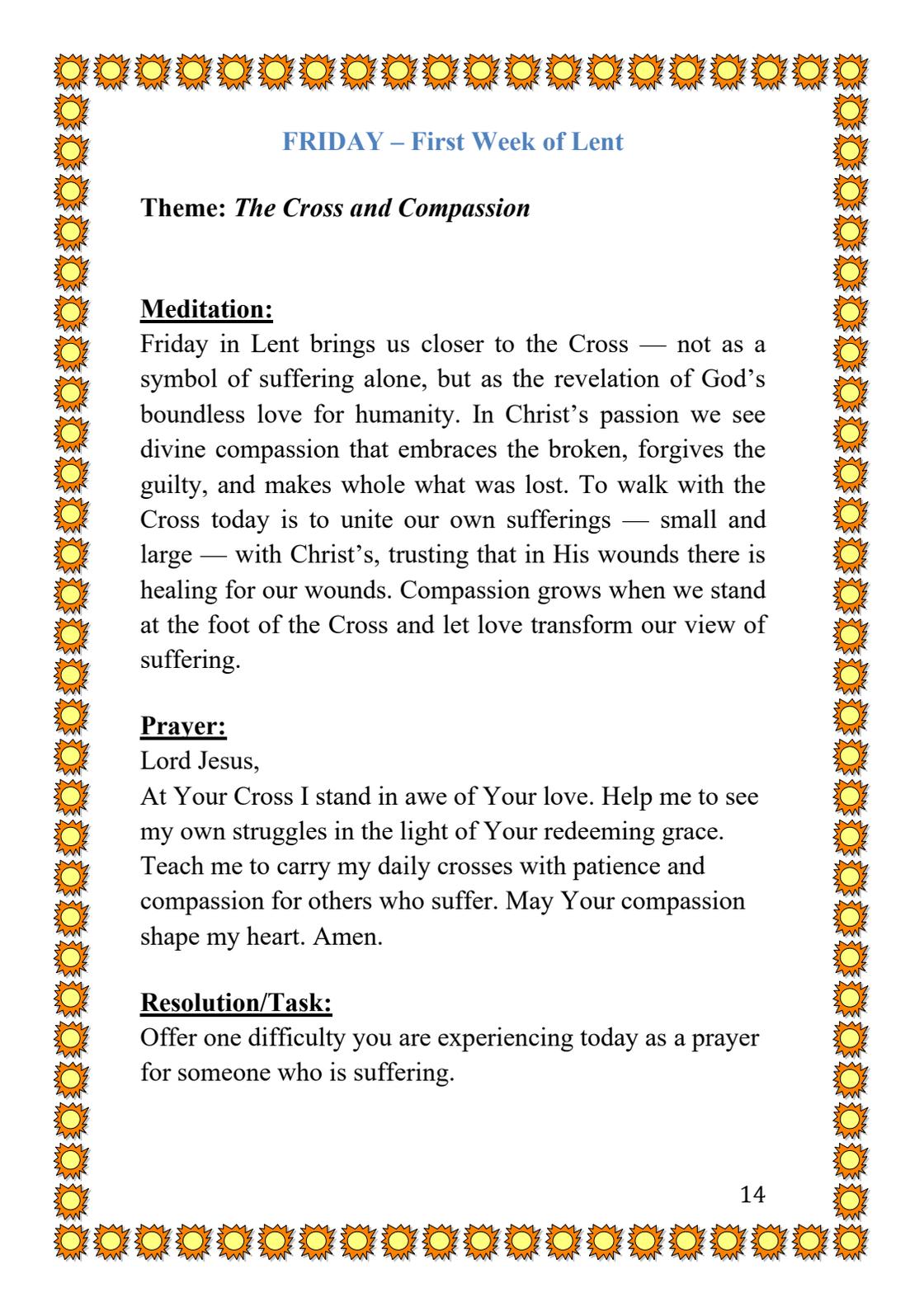
Lent calls us to a mercy that goes beyond sentiment — a mercy expressed in tangible action. Jesus wept for the suffering, fed the hungry, welcomed the outcast, and forgave sinners. Our Lenten journey is not complete if it does not lead us outward in compassion. Mercy requires the courage to see another’s face without judgment — to offer presence, to listen, and to serve. As Christ’s mercy transforms us, we become instruments of mercy in a world longing for healing.

**Prayer:**

God of Infinite Mercy,  
Open my eyes to see those who are in need and grant me a heart that responds generously. Let my acts of mercy be signs of Your love reaching into the world. May I serve with humility and grace, knowing every person I meet bears Your image. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Perform one concrete act of mercy today — give time, attention, or resources to someone without expectation.



## FRIDAY – First Week of Lent

**Theme:** *The Cross and Compassion*

**Meditation:**

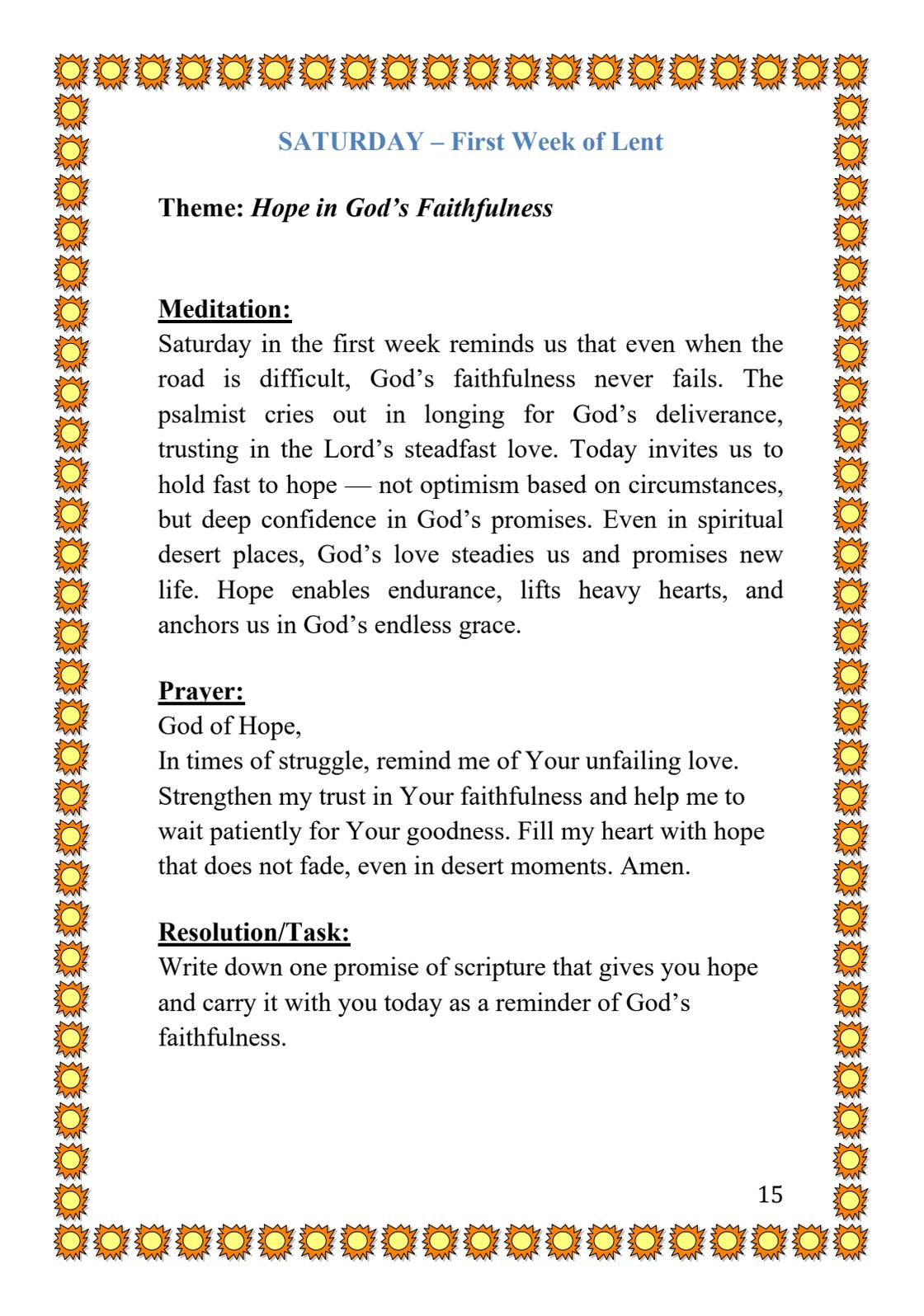
Friday in Lent brings us closer to the Cross — not as a symbol of suffering alone, but as the revelation of God’s boundless love for humanity. In Christ’s passion we see divine compassion that embraces the broken, forgives the guilty, and makes whole what was lost. To walk with the Cross today is to unite our own sufferings — small and large — with Christ’s, trusting that in His wounds there is healing for our wounds. Compassion grows when we stand at the foot of the Cross and let love transform our view of suffering.

**Prayer:**

**Resolution/Task:**

Offer one difficulty you are experiencing today as a prayer for someone who is suffering.



## SATURDAY – First Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Hope in God's Faithfulness*

**Meditation:**

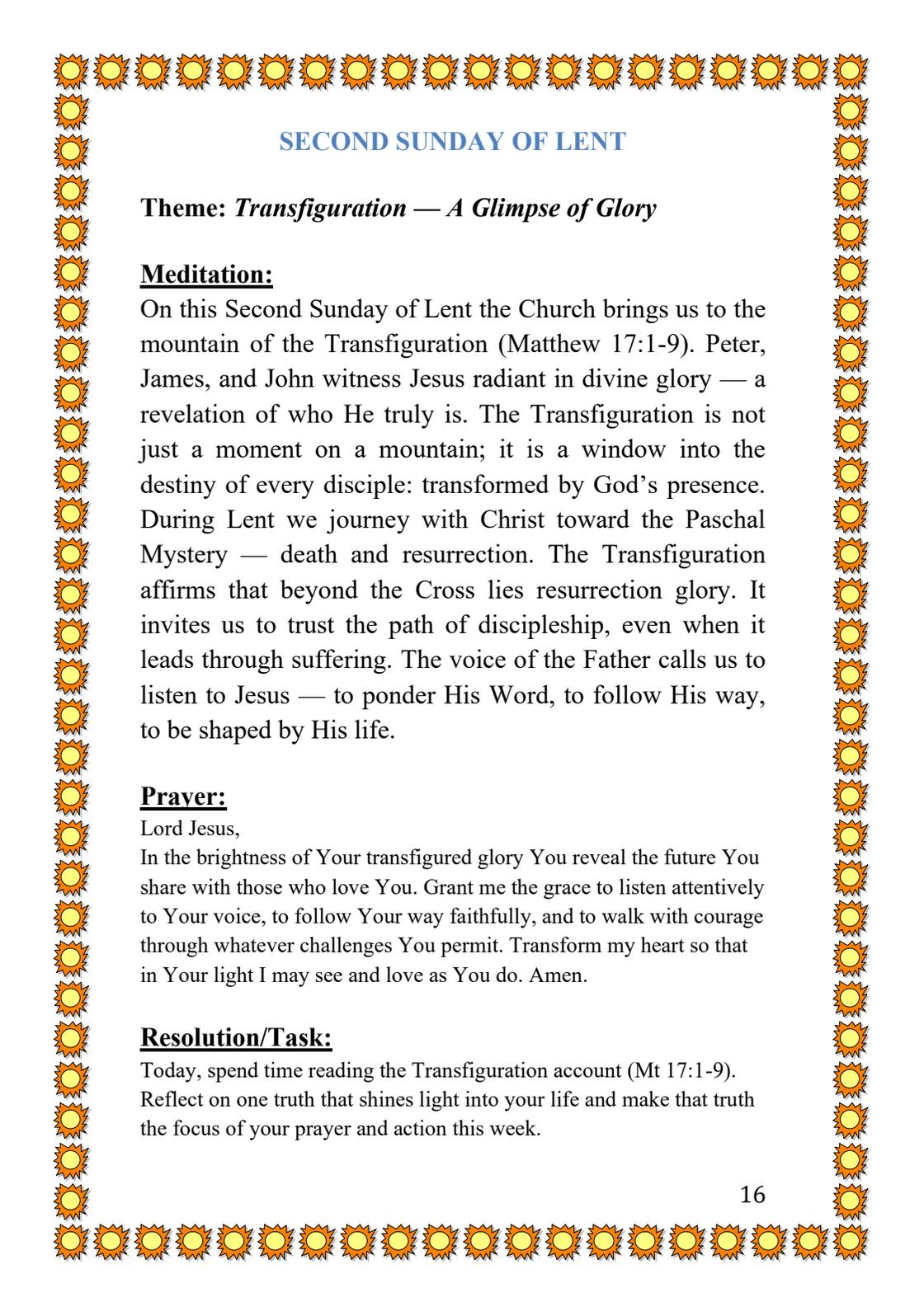
Saturday in the first week reminds us that even when the road is difficult, God's faithfulness never fails. The psalmist cries out in longing for God's deliverance, trusting in the Lord's steadfast love. Today invites us to hold fast to hope — not optimism based on circumstances, but deep confidence in God's promises. Even in spiritual desert places, God's love steadies us and promises new life. Hope enables endurance, lifts heavy hearts, and anchors us in God's endless grace.

**Prayer:**

God of Hope,  
In times of struggle, remind me of Your unfailing love.  
Strengthen my trust in Your faithfulness and help me to wait patiently for Your goodness. Fill my heart with hope that does not fade, even in desert moments. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Write down one promise of scripture that gives you hope and carry it with you today as a reminder of God's faithfulness.



## SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

**Theme:** *Transfiguration — A Glimpse of Glory*

**Meditation:**

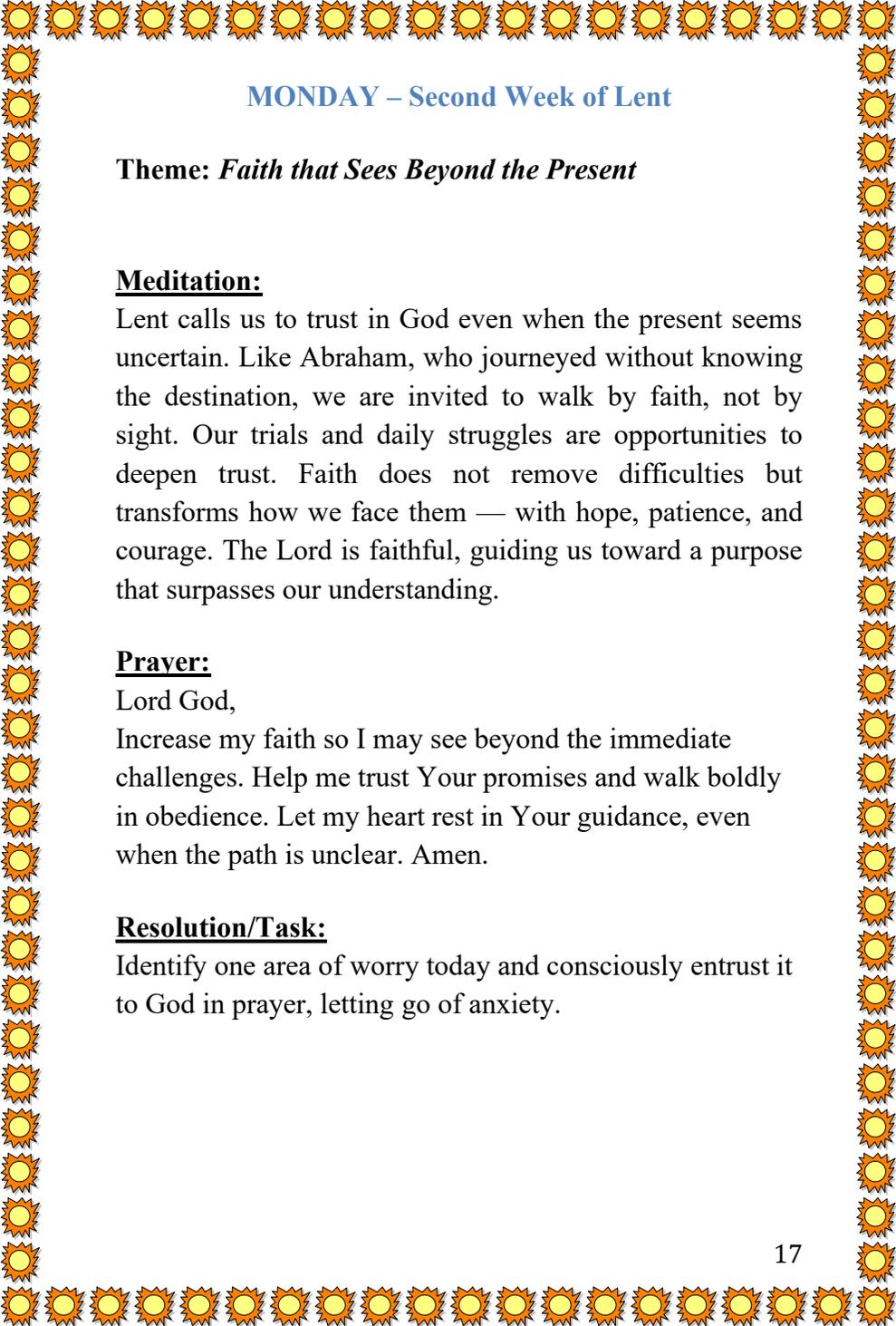
On this Second Sunday of Lent the Church brings us to the mountain of the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-9). Peter, James, and John witness Jesus radiant in divine glory — a revelation of who He truly is. The Transfiguration is not just a moment on a mountain; it is a window into the destiny of every disciple: transformed by God’s presence. During Lent we journey with Christ toward the Paschal Mystery — death and resurrection. The Transfiguration affirms that beyond the Cross lies resurrection glory. It invites us to trust the path of discipleship, even when it leads through suffering. The voice of the Father calls us to listen to Jesus — to ponder His Word, to follow His way, to be shaped by His life.

**Prayer:**

Lord Jesus,  
In the brightness of Your transfigured glory You reveal the future You share with those who love You. Grant me the grace to listen attentively to Your voice, to follow Your way faithfully, and to walk with courage through whatever challenges You permit. Transform my heart so that in Your light I may see and love as You do. Amen.

**Resolution/Task:**

Today, spend time reading the Transfiguration account (Mt 17:1-9). Reflect on one truth that shines light into your life and make that truth the focus of your prayer and action this week.



## MONDAY – Second Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Faith that Sees Beyond the Present*

**Meditation:**

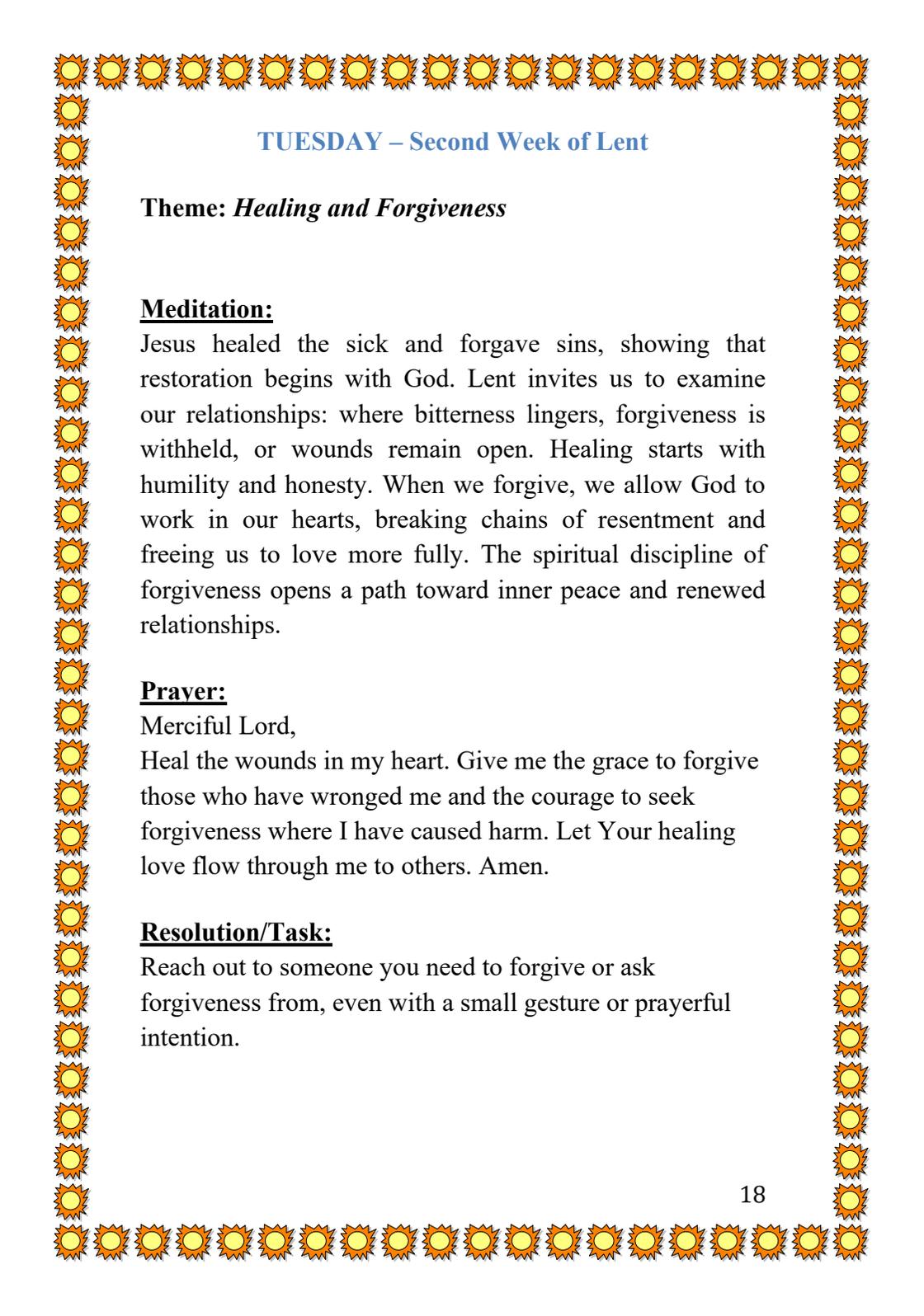
Lent calls us to trust in God even when the present seems uncertain. Like Abraham, who journeyed without knowing the destination, we are invited to walk by faith, not by sight. Our trials and daily struggles are opportunities to deepen trust. Faith does not remove difficulties but transforms how we face them — with hope, patience, and courage. The Lord is faithful, guiding us toward a purpose that surpasses our understanding.

**Prayer:**

Lord God,

**Resolution/Task:**

Identify one area of worry today and consciously entrust it to God in prayer, letting go of anxiety.



## TUESDAY – Second Week of Lent

**Theme:** *Healing and Forgiveness*

**Meditation:**

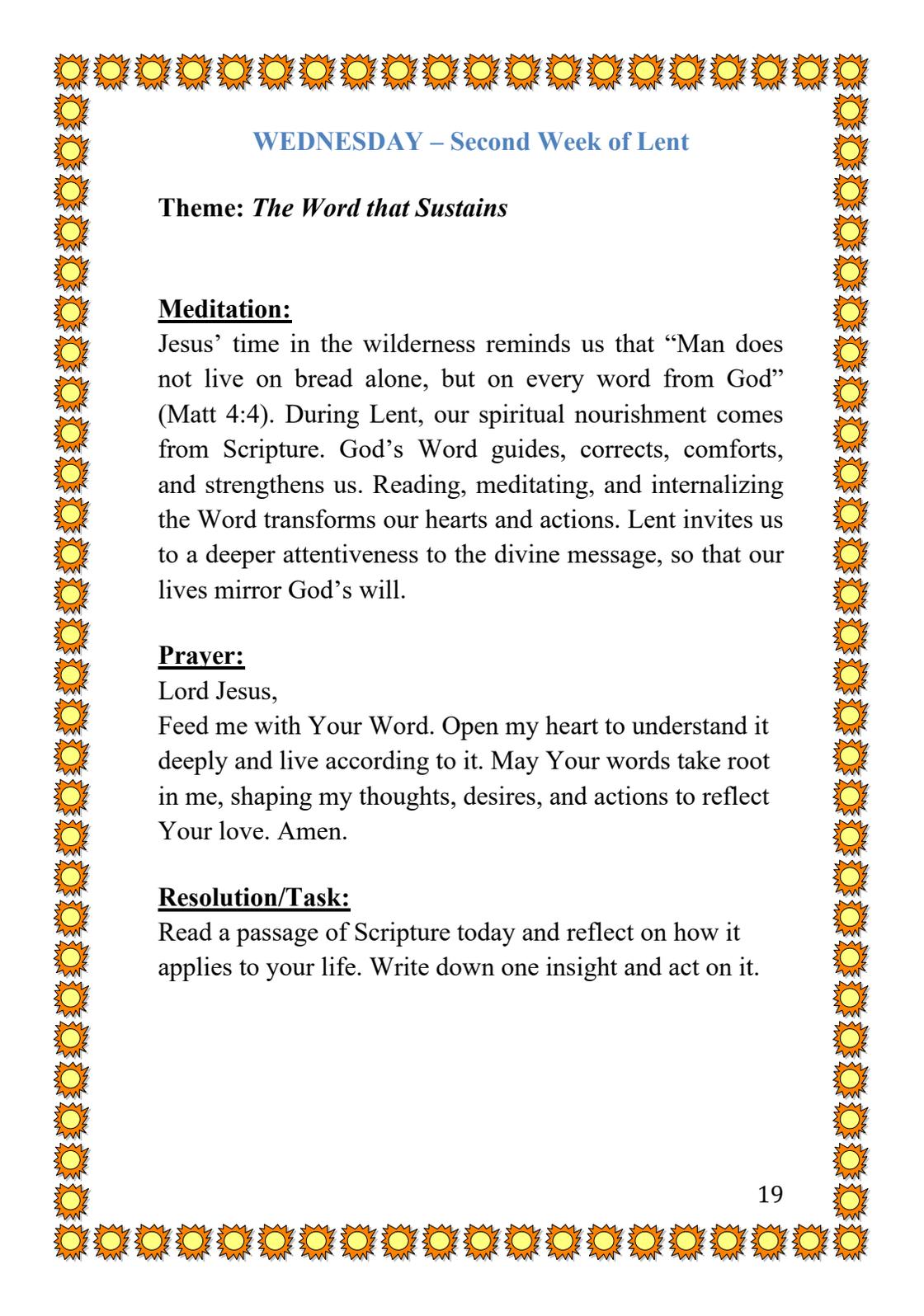

**Resolution/Task:**

## WEDNESDAY – Second Week of Lent

**Theme:** *The Word that Sustains*

**Meditation:**

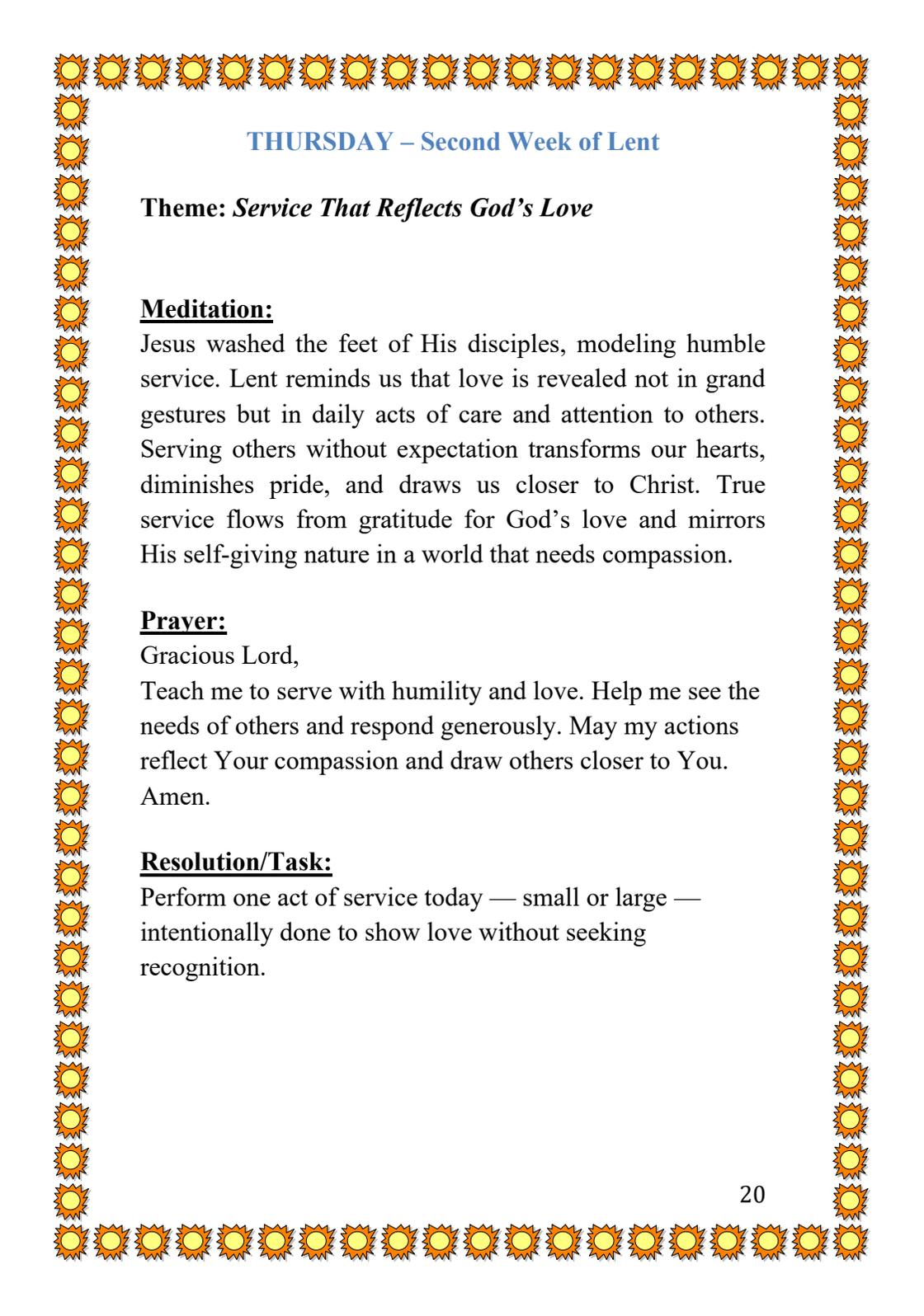
Jesus' time in the wilderness reminds us that "Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word from God" (Matt 4:4). During Lent, our spiritual nourishment comes from Scripture. **Meditation:**

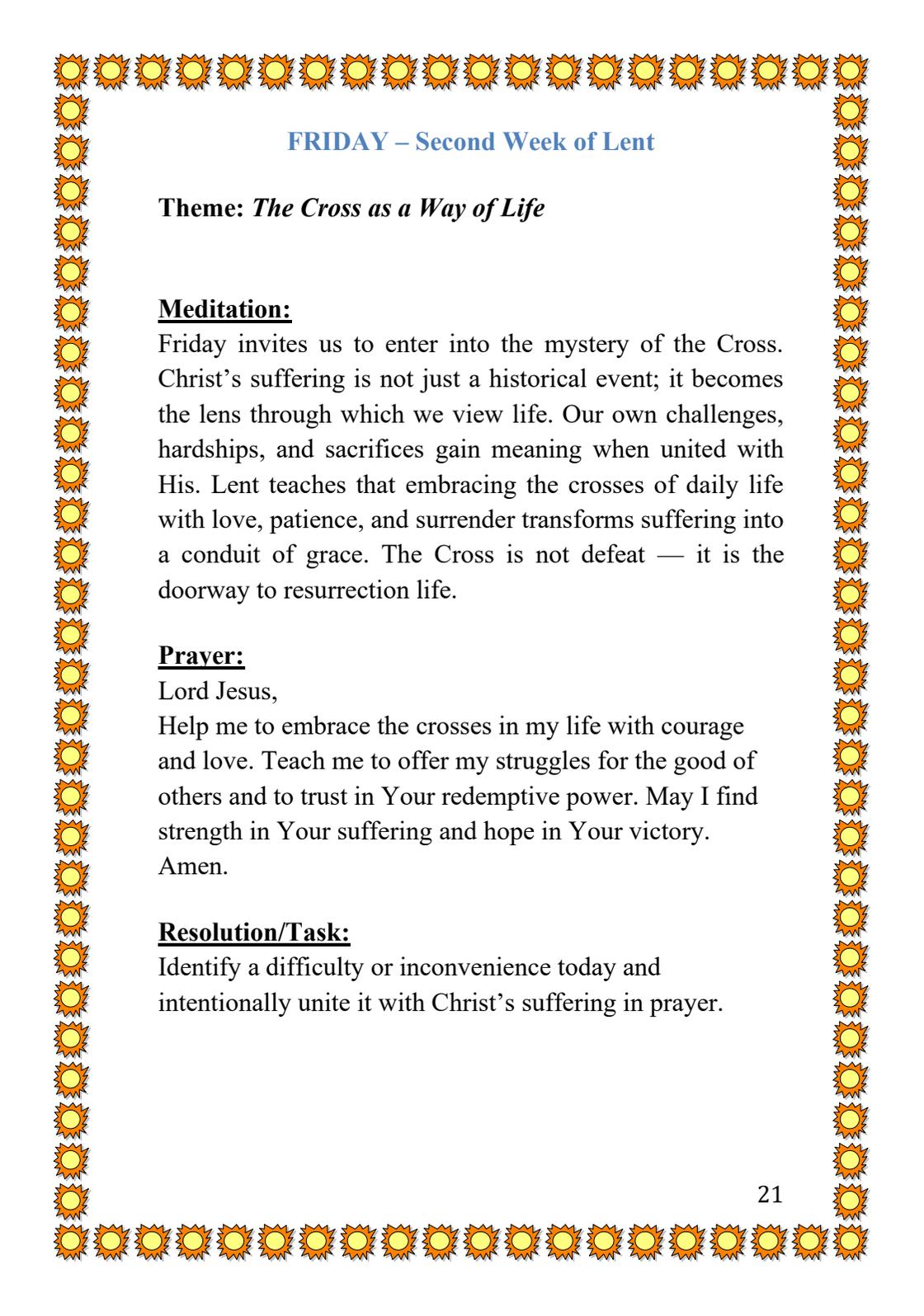

## FRIDAY – Second Week of Lent

**Meditation:**

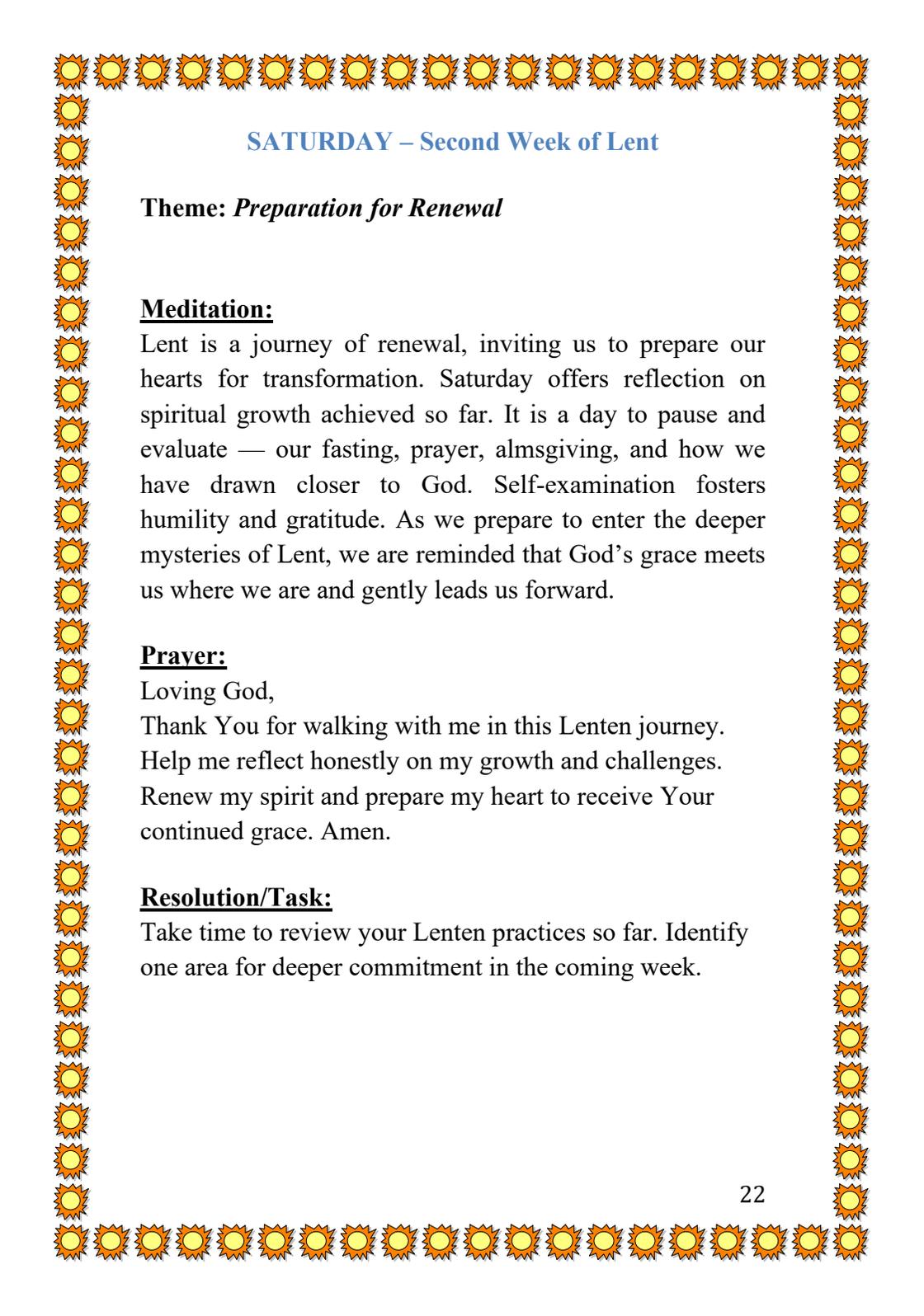

**Meditation:**

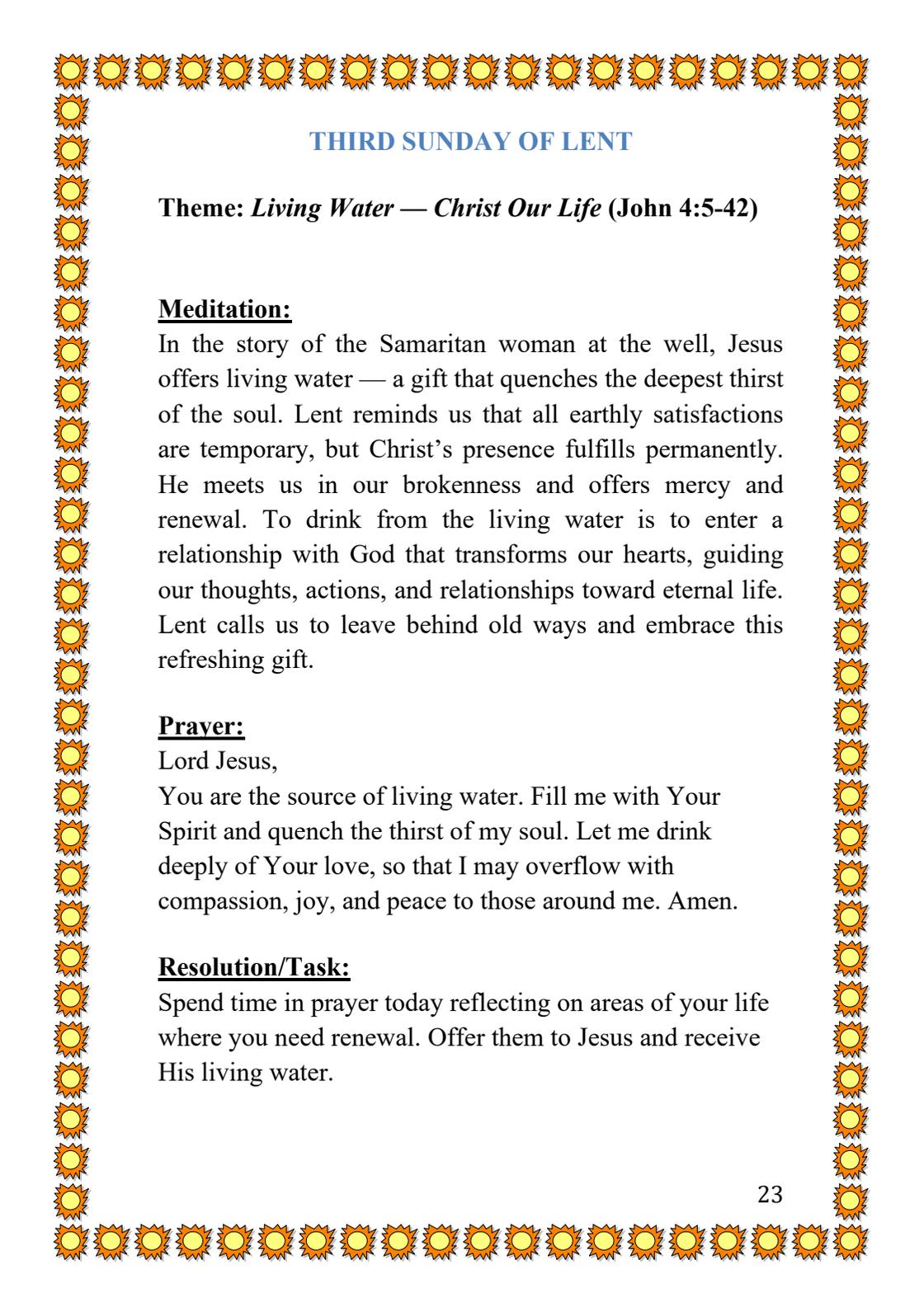

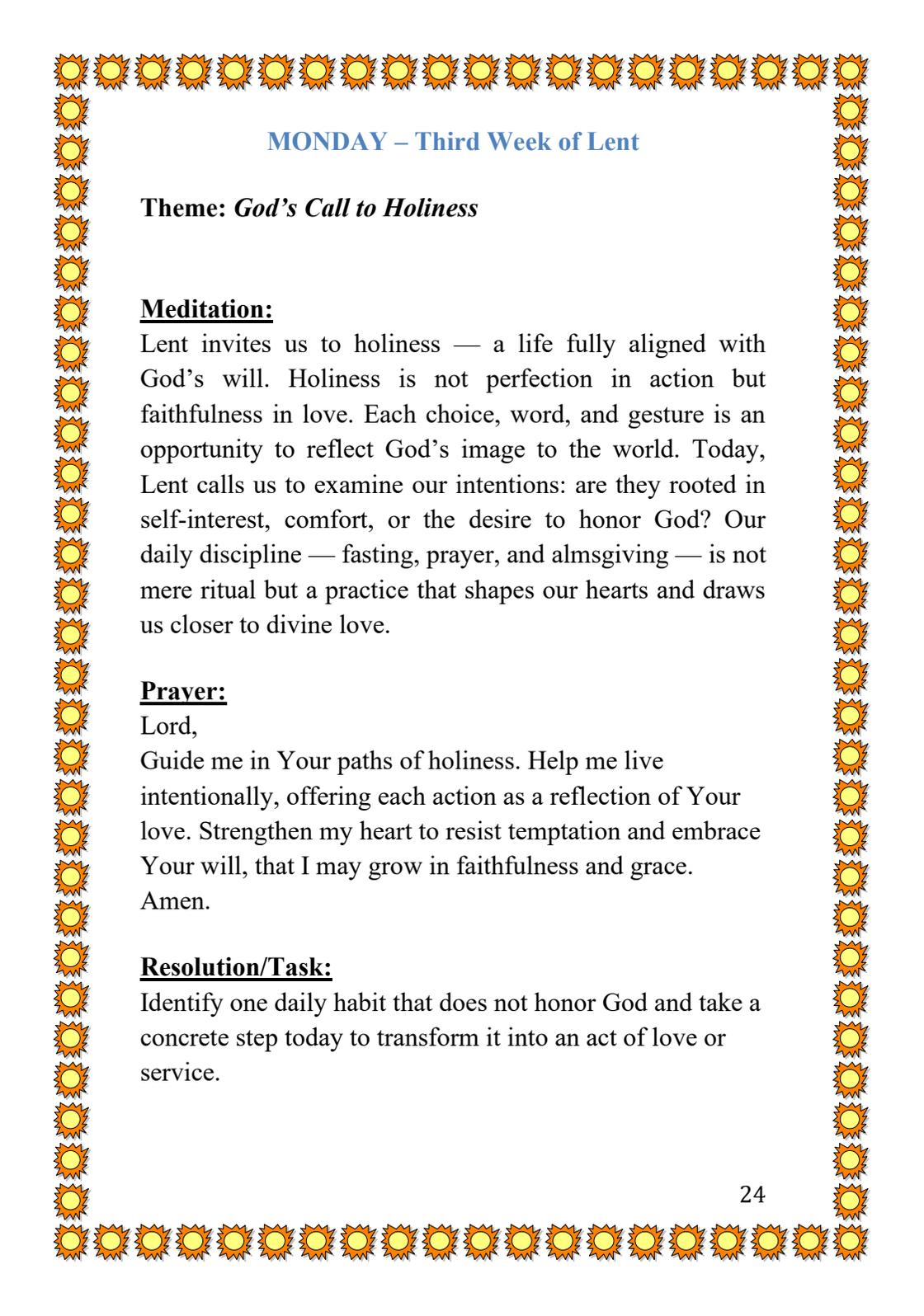
**Prayer:**

**Meditation:**

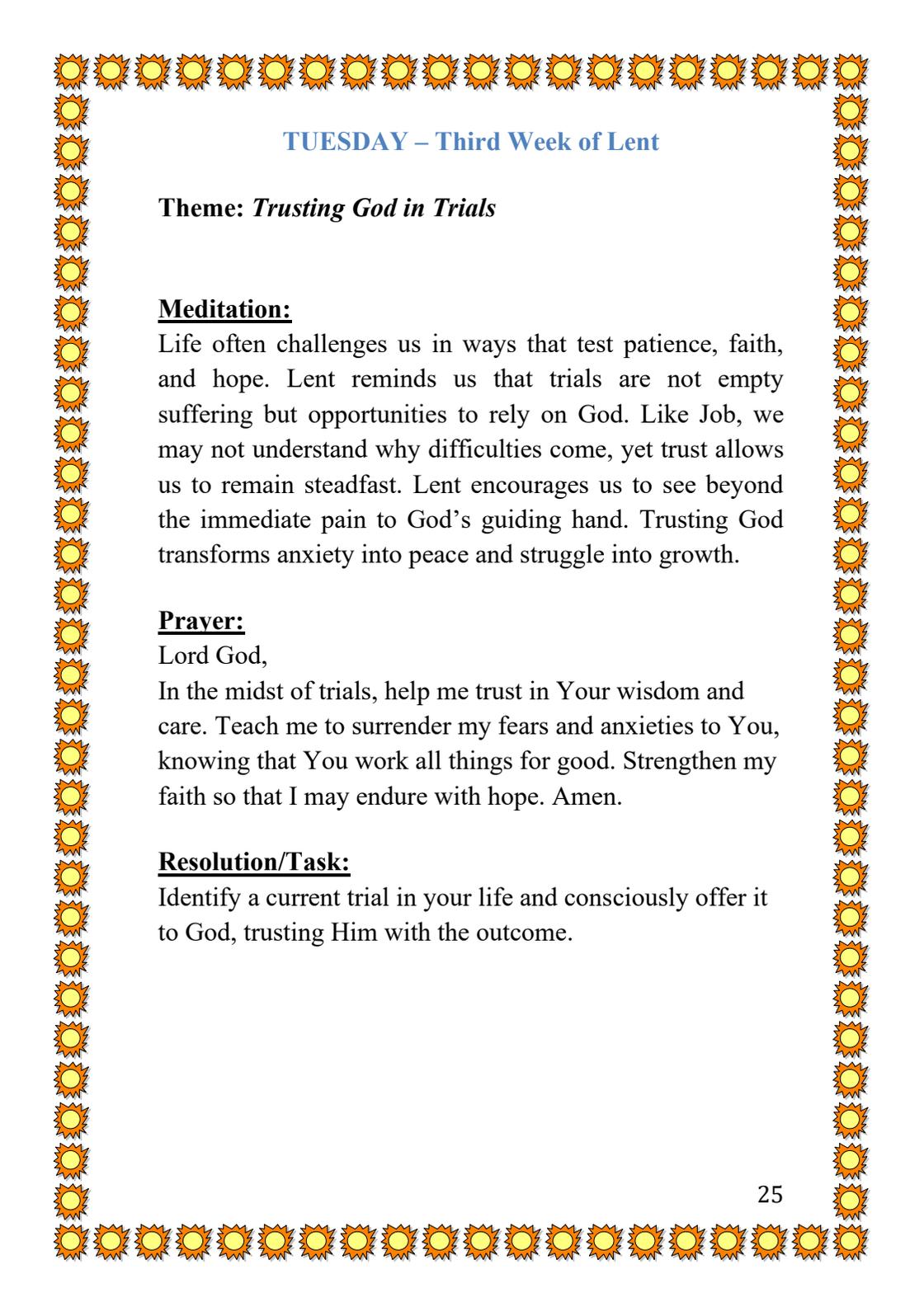

**Meditation:**

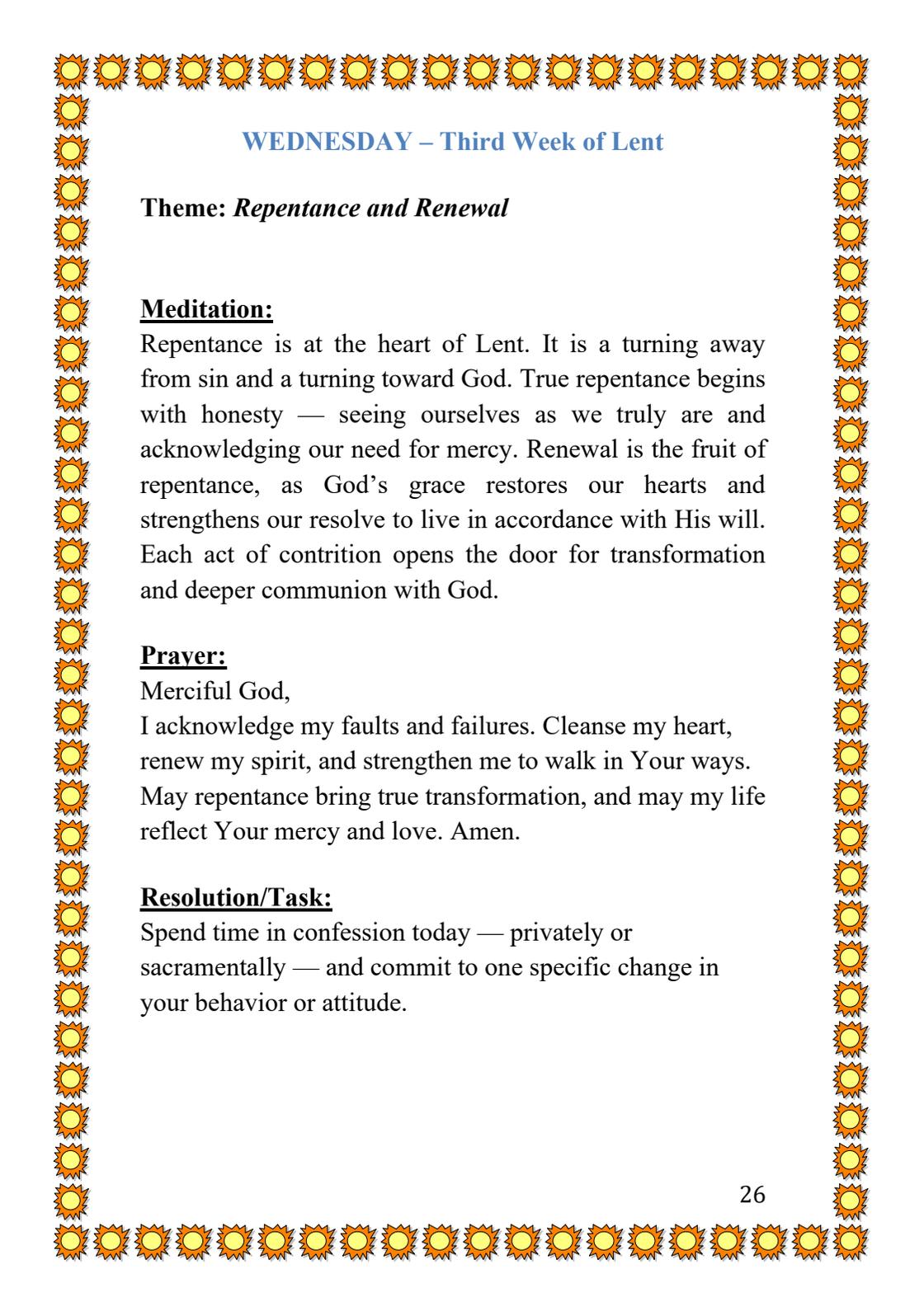

**Meditation:**

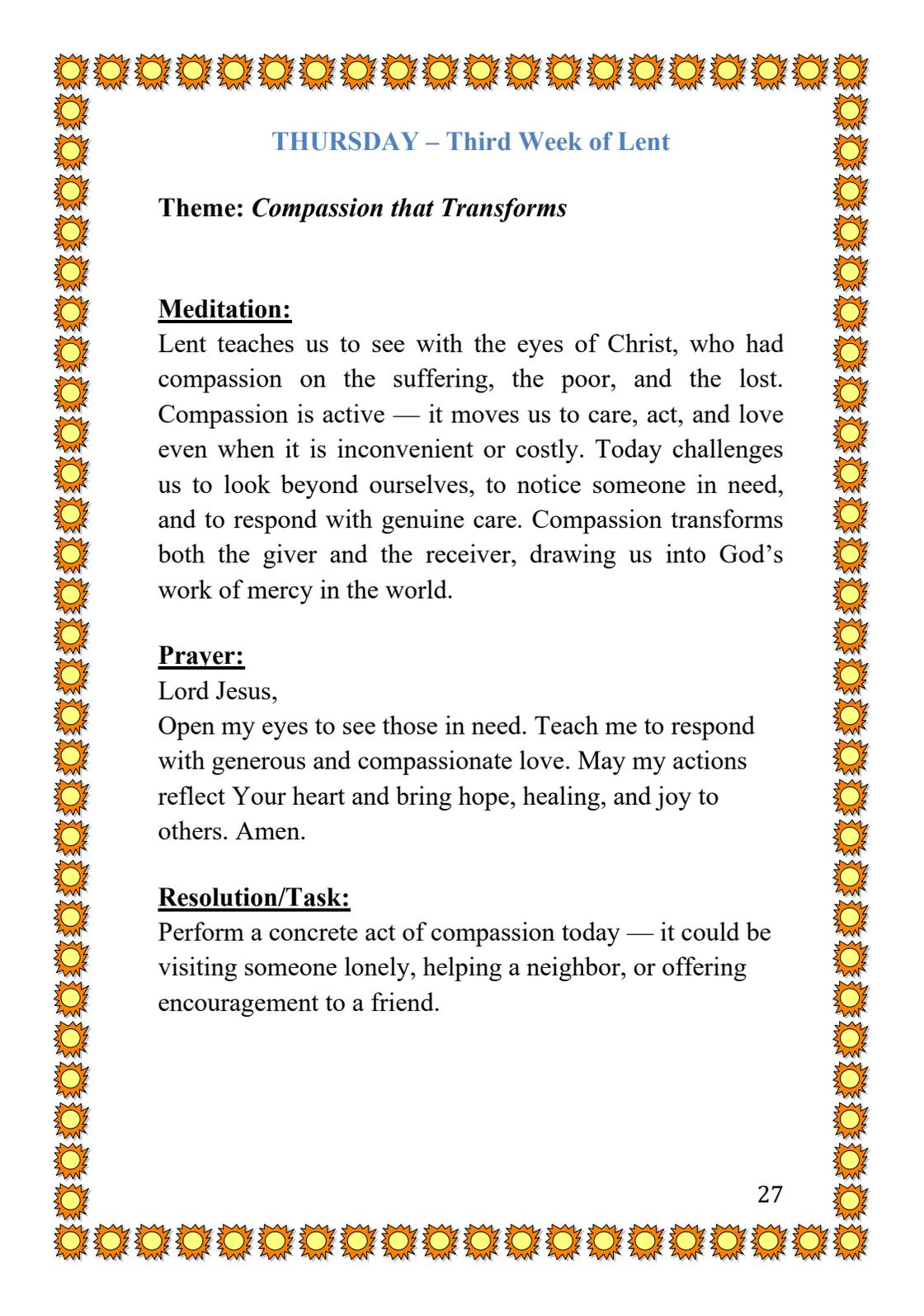

**Meditation:**

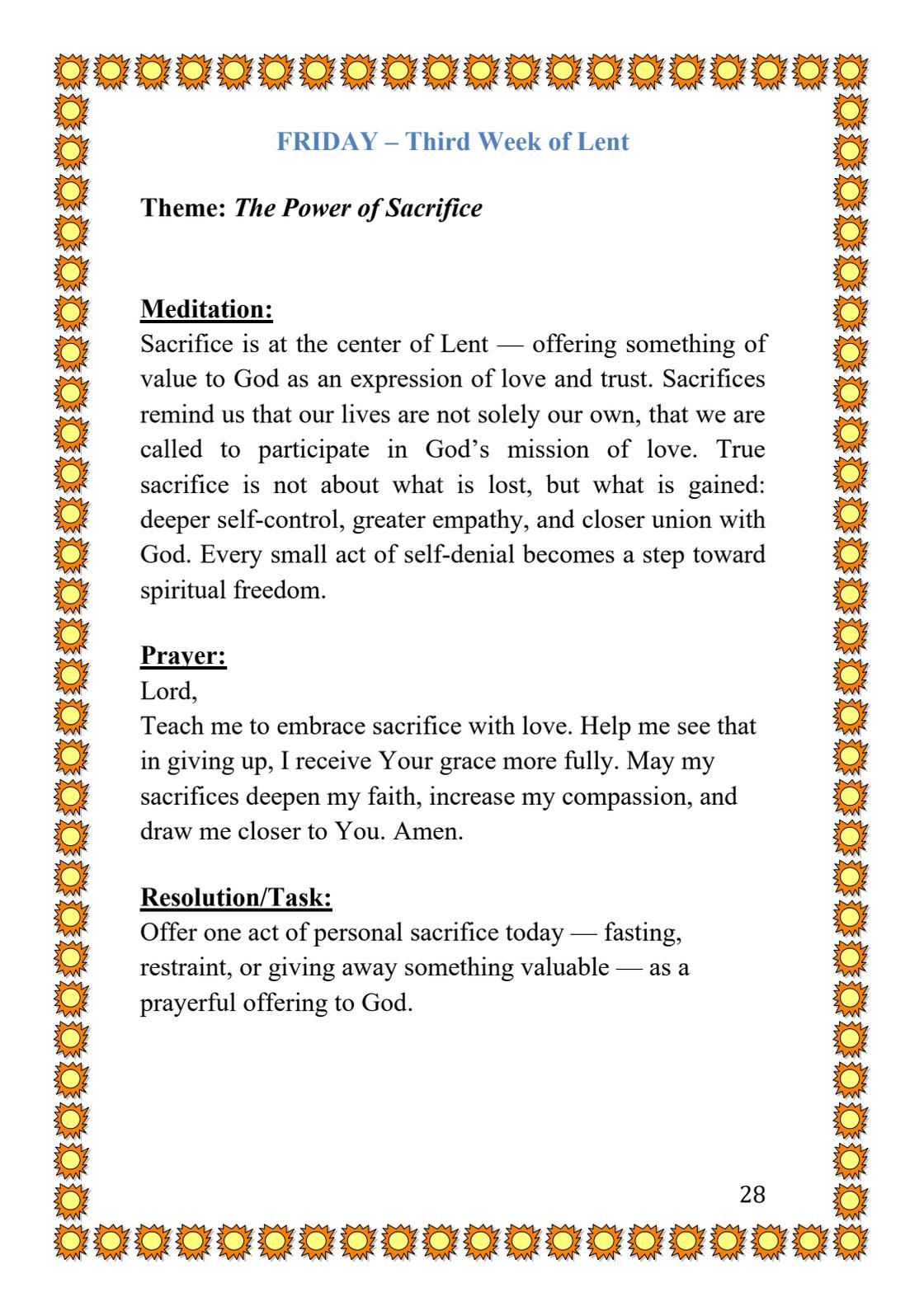

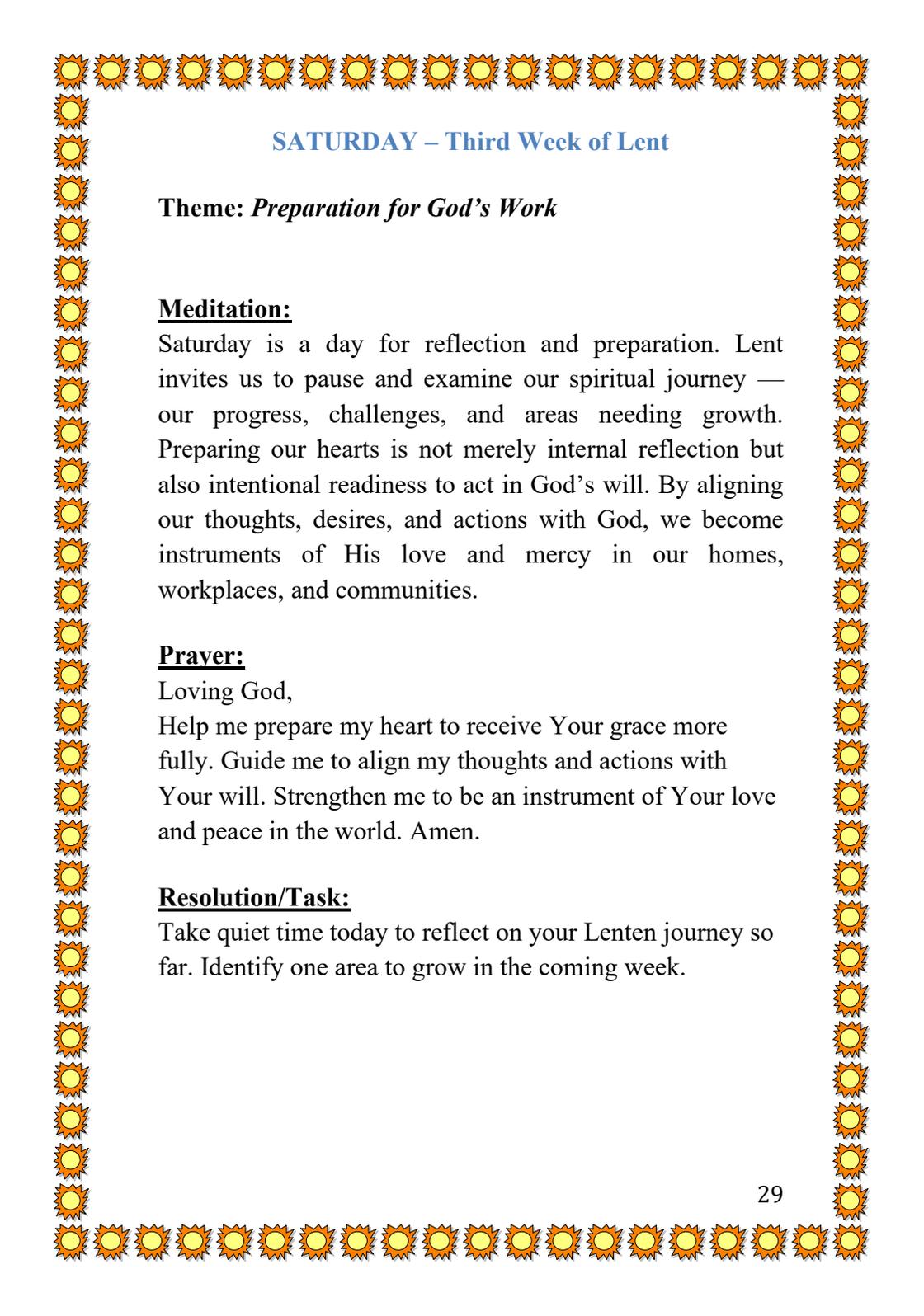
**Prayer:**

**Meditation:**

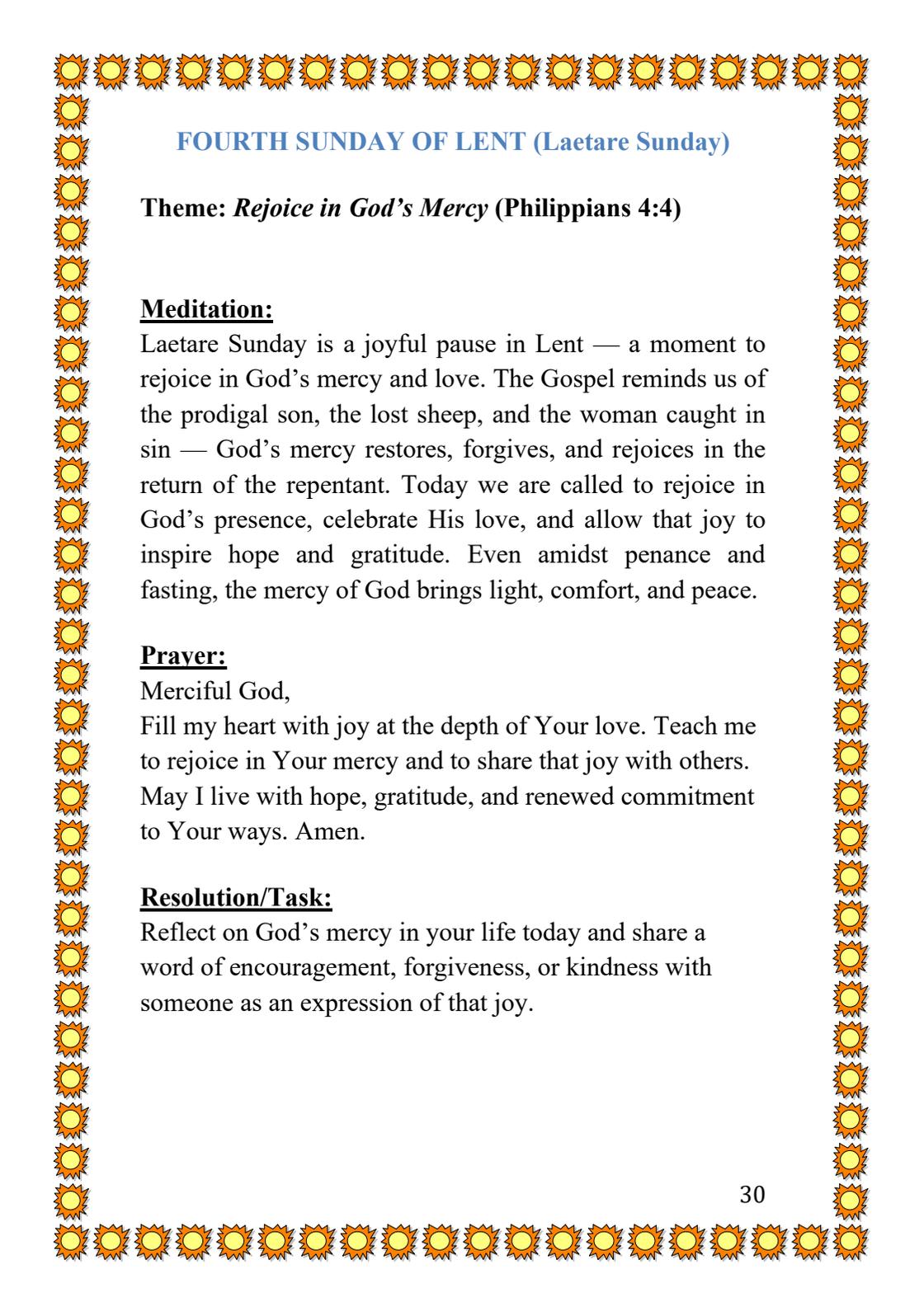

**Meditation:**

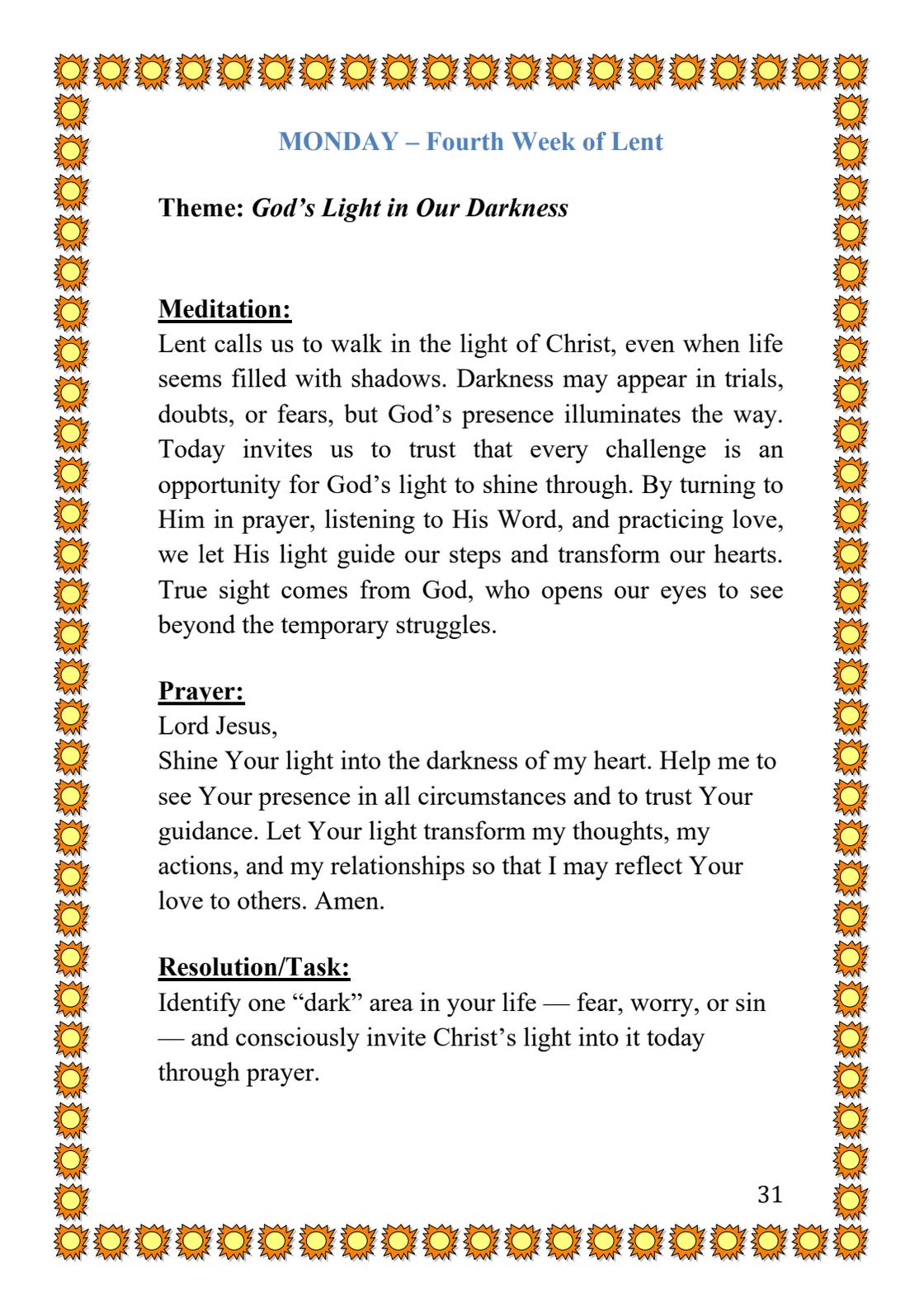
Laetare Sunday is a joyful pause in Lent — a moment to rejoice in God's mercy and love. The Gospel reminds us of the prodigal son, the lost sheep, and the woman caught in sin — God's mercy restores, forgives, and rejoices in the return of the repentant. Even amidst penance and fasting, the mercy of God brings light, comfort, and peace.

**Prayer:**

**Resolution/Task:**

Reflect on God's mercy in your life today and share a word of encouragement, forgiveness, or kindness with someone as an expression of that joy.



## MONDAY – Fourth Week of Lent

**Theme:** *God's Light in Our Darkness*

**Meditation:**

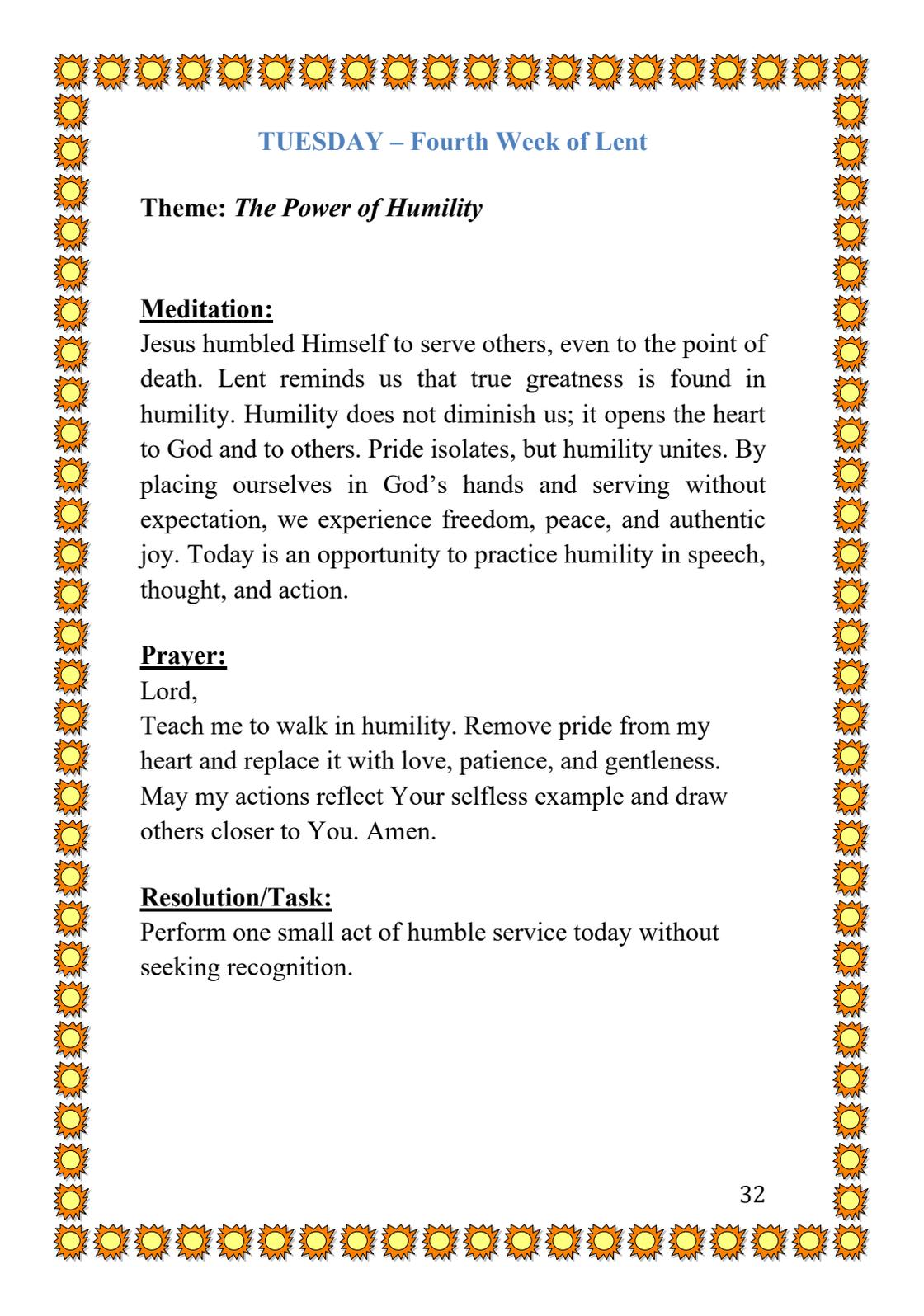
Lent calls us to walk in the light of Christ, even when life seems filled with shadows. Darkness may appear in trials, doubts, or fears, but God's presence illuminates the way. Today invites us to trust that every challenge is an opportunity for God's light to shine through. **Prayer:**

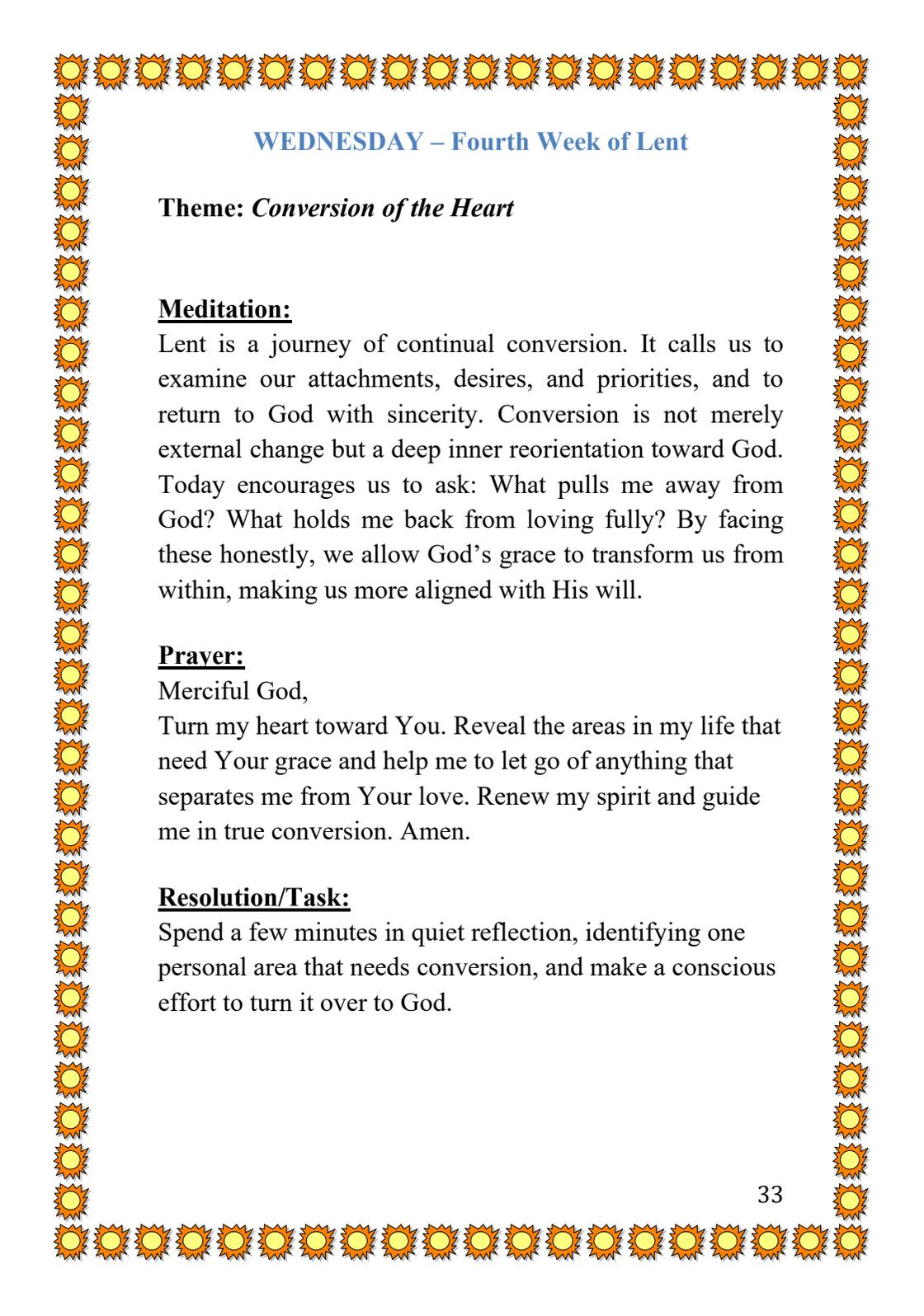
**Prayer:**

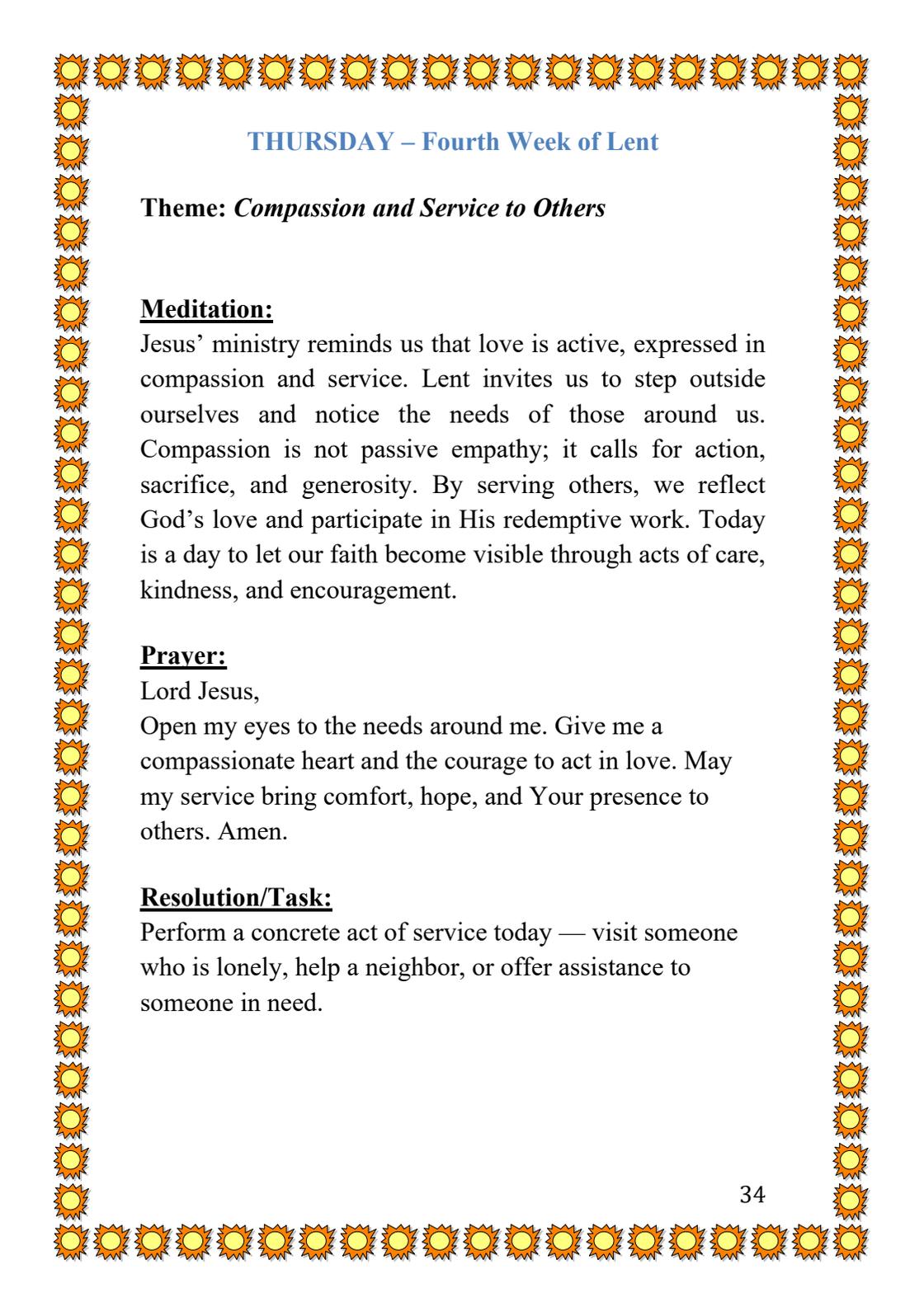
**Prayer:**

**Meditation:**

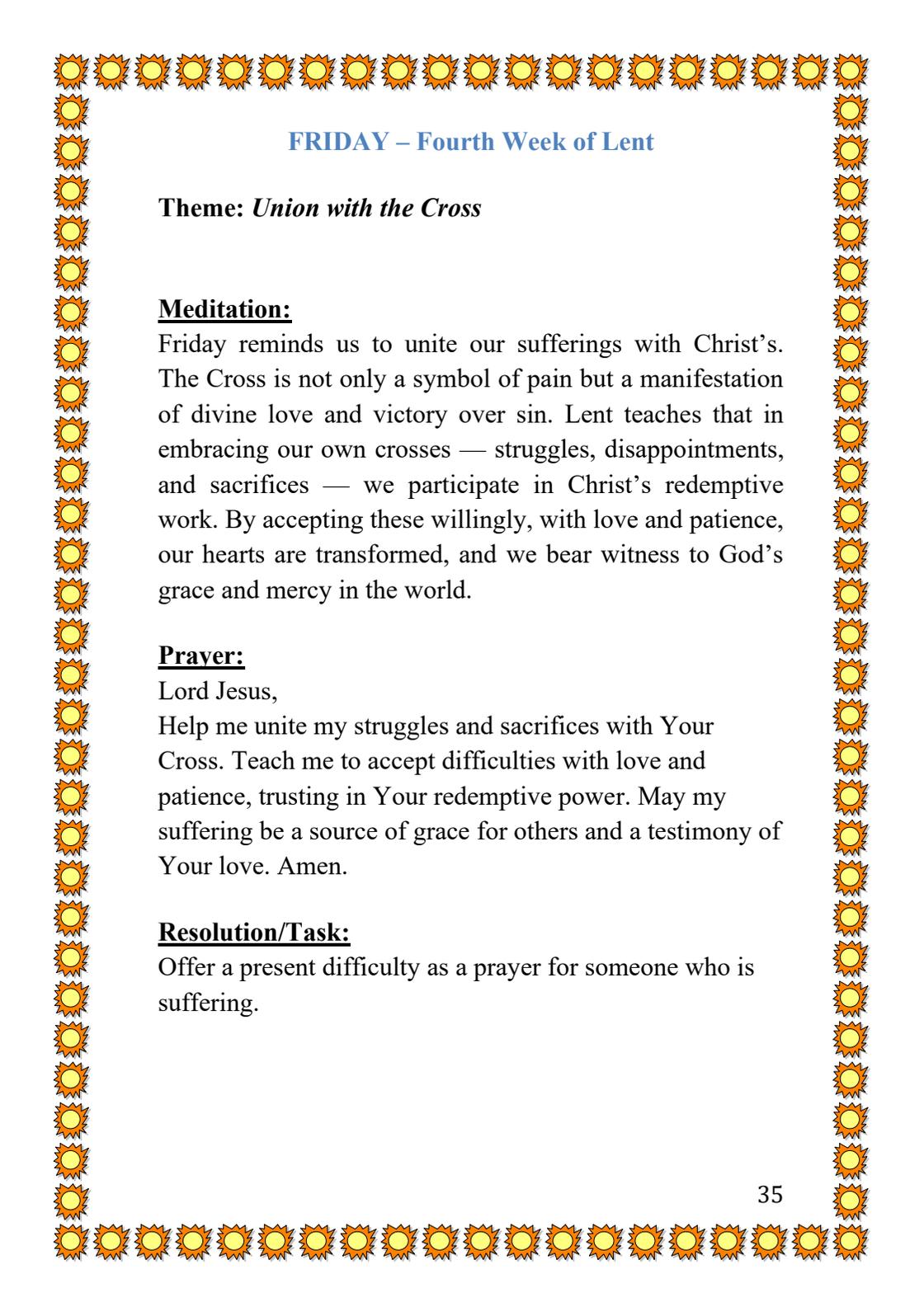

**Meditation:**

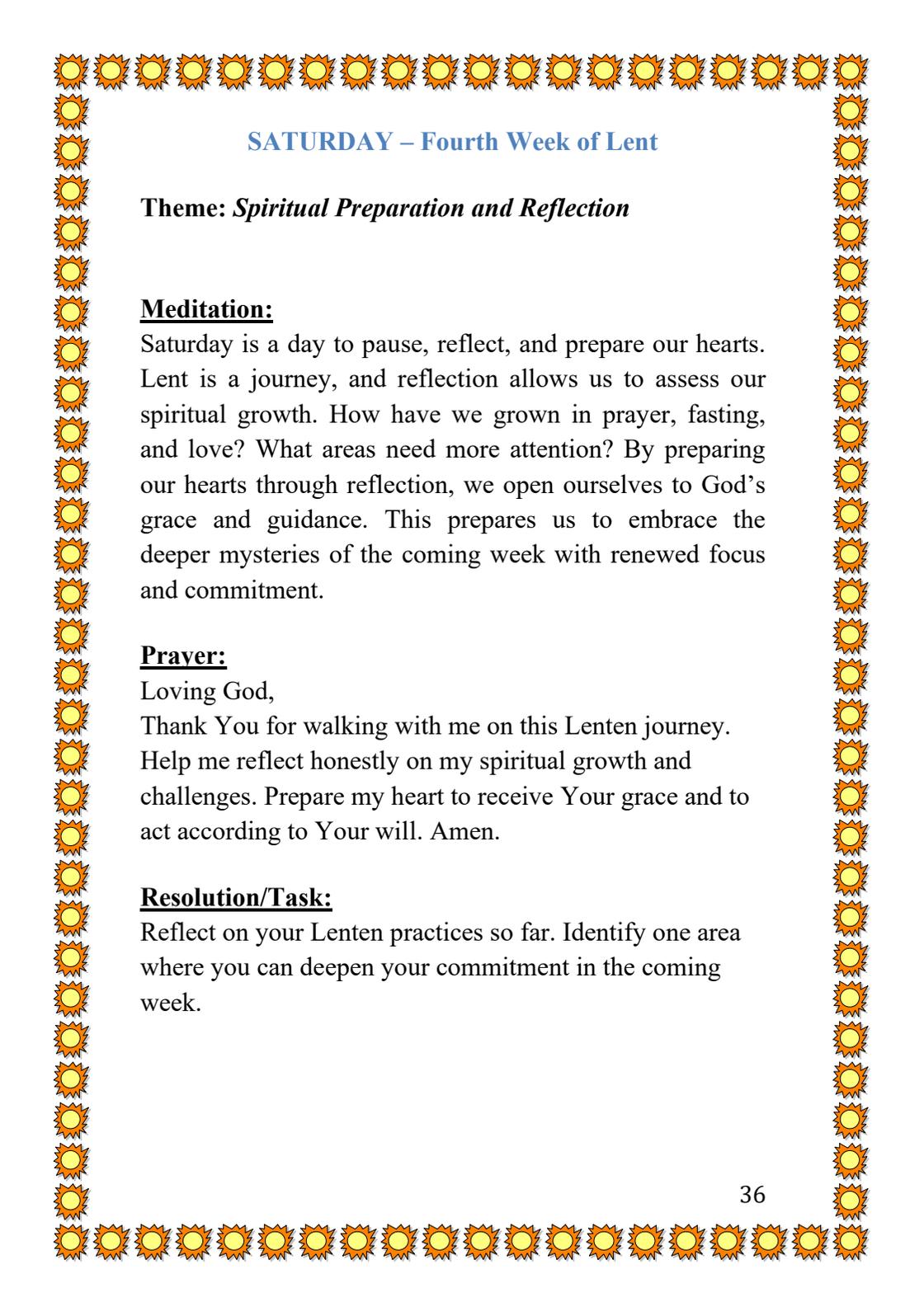

**Meditation:**

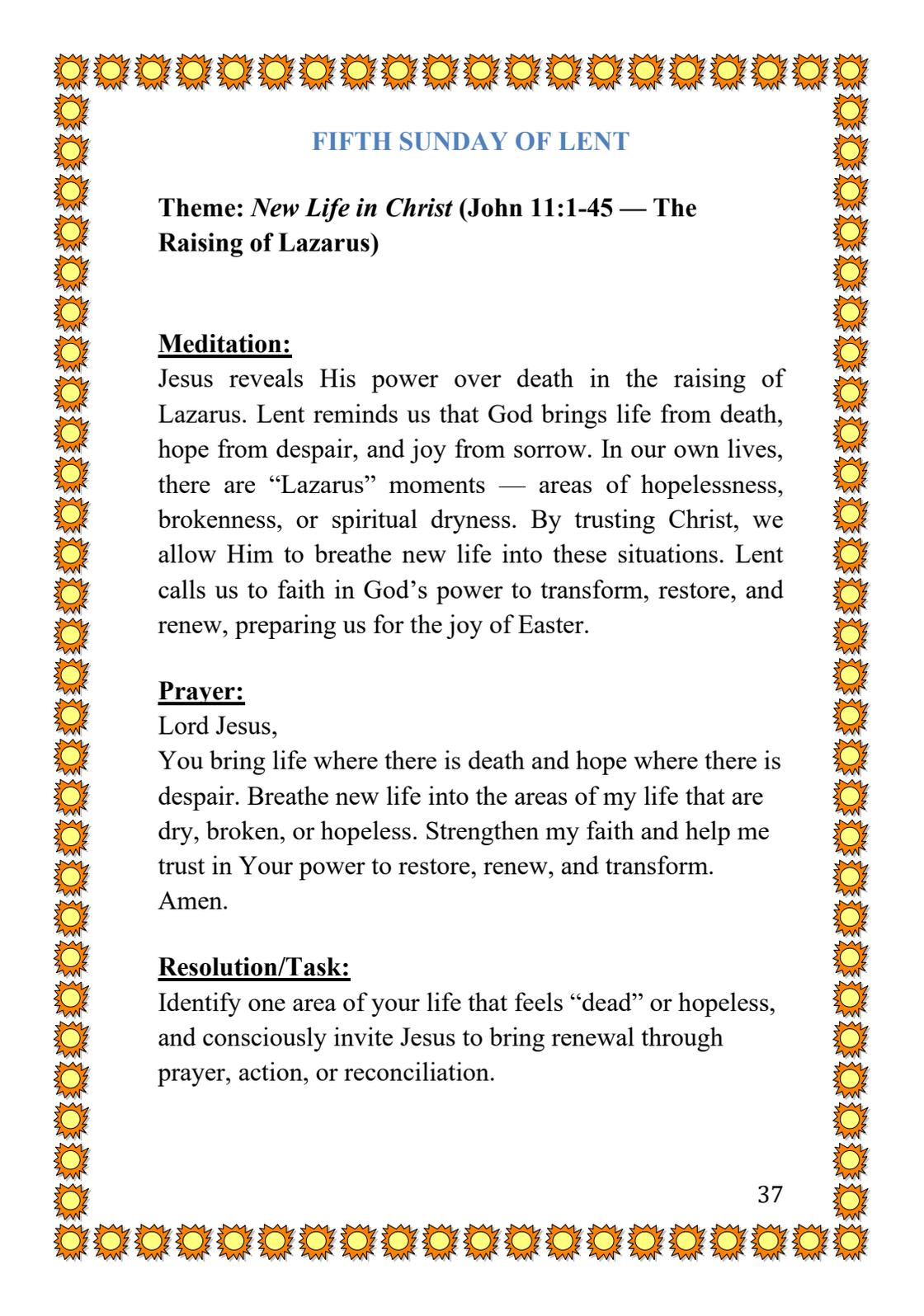

**Meditation:**

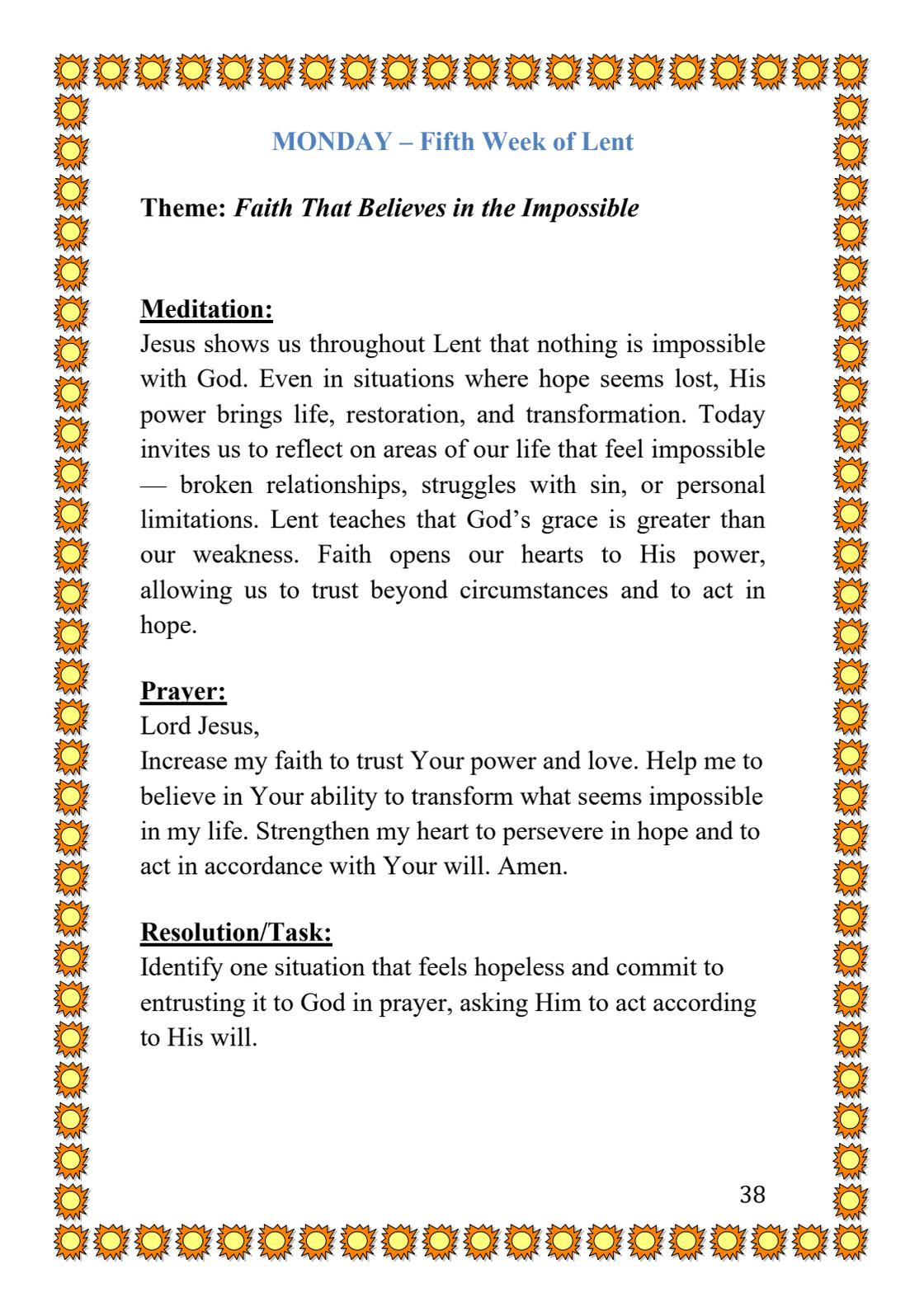

**Meditation:**

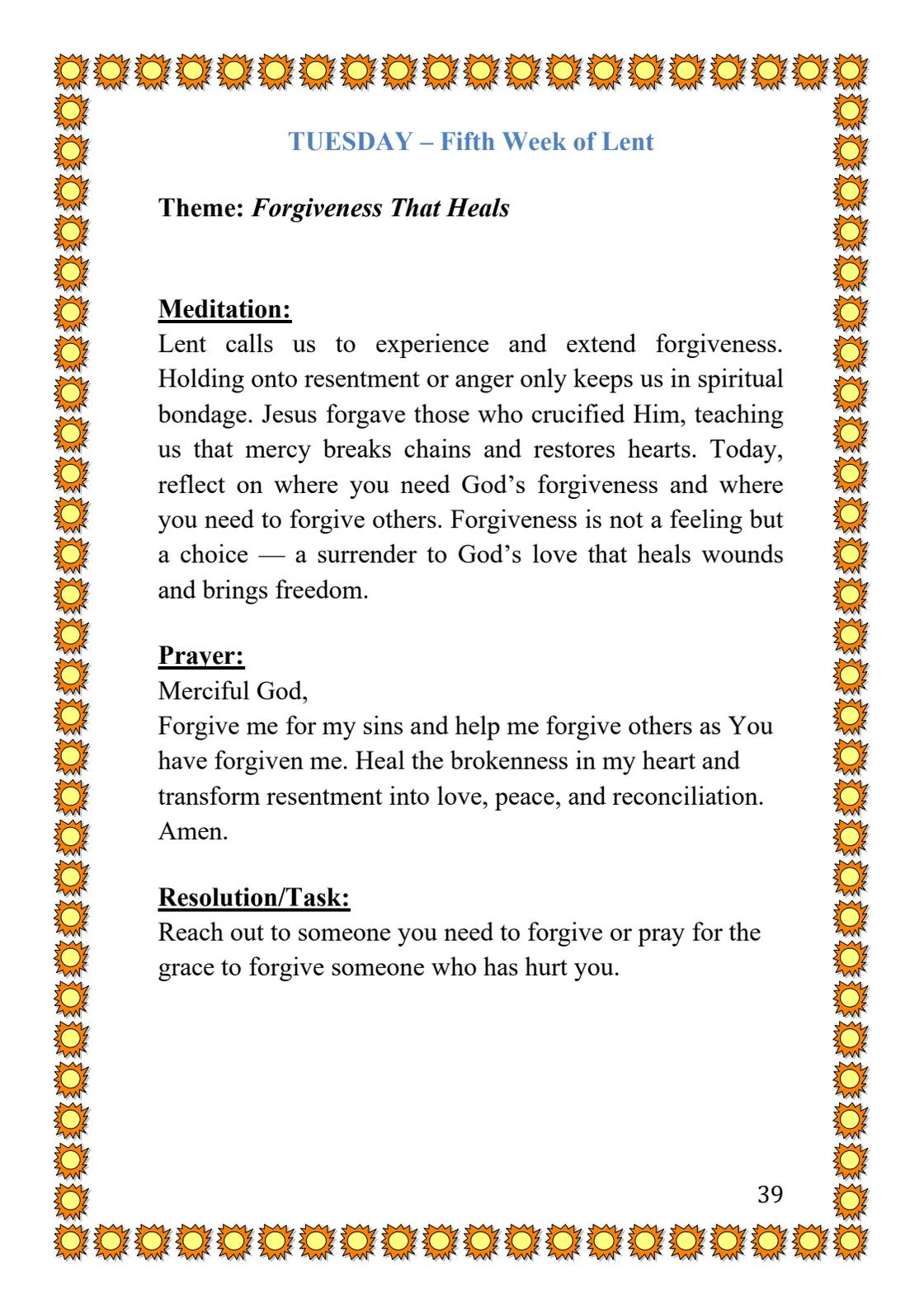

**Meditation:**

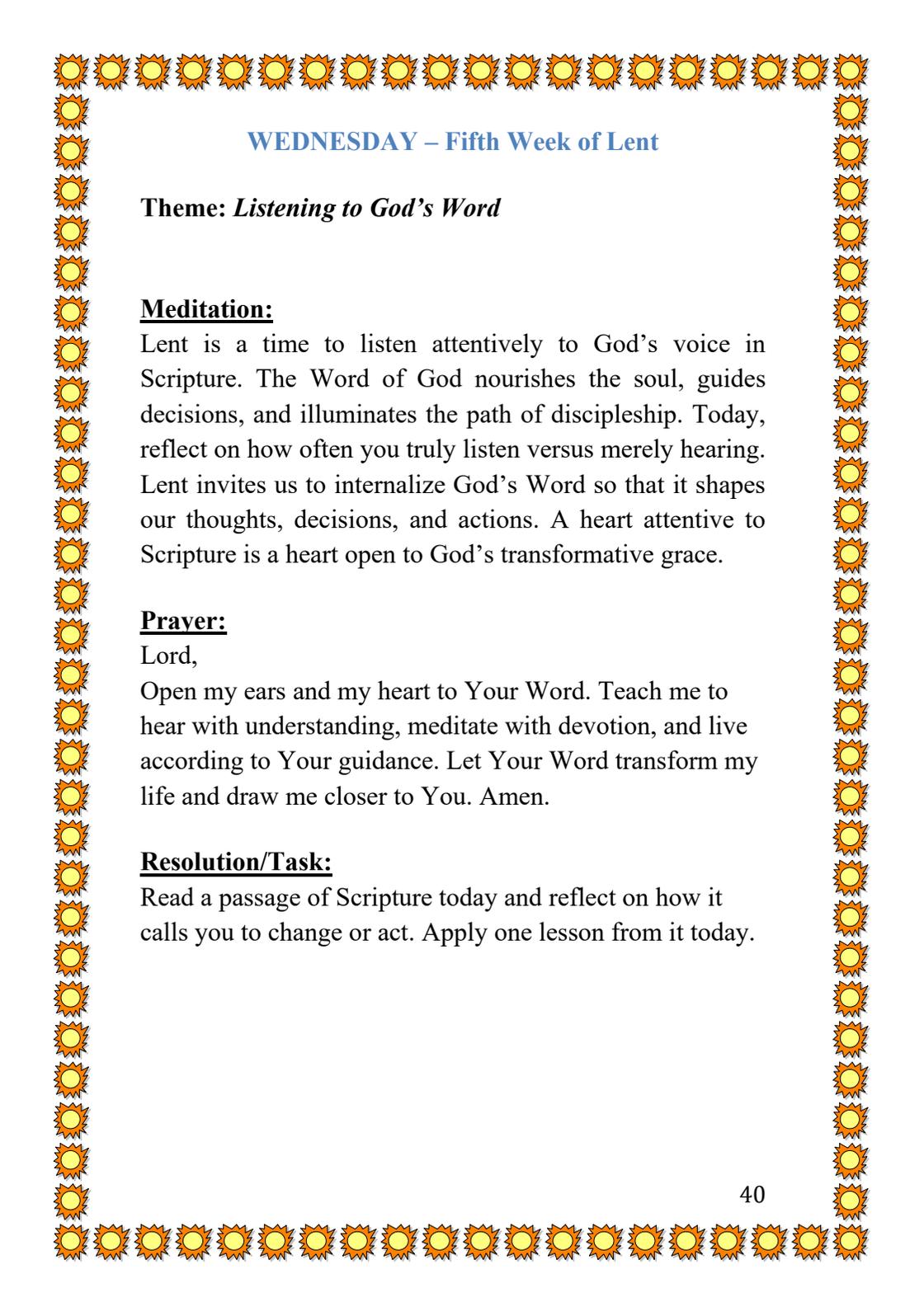

**Meditation:**

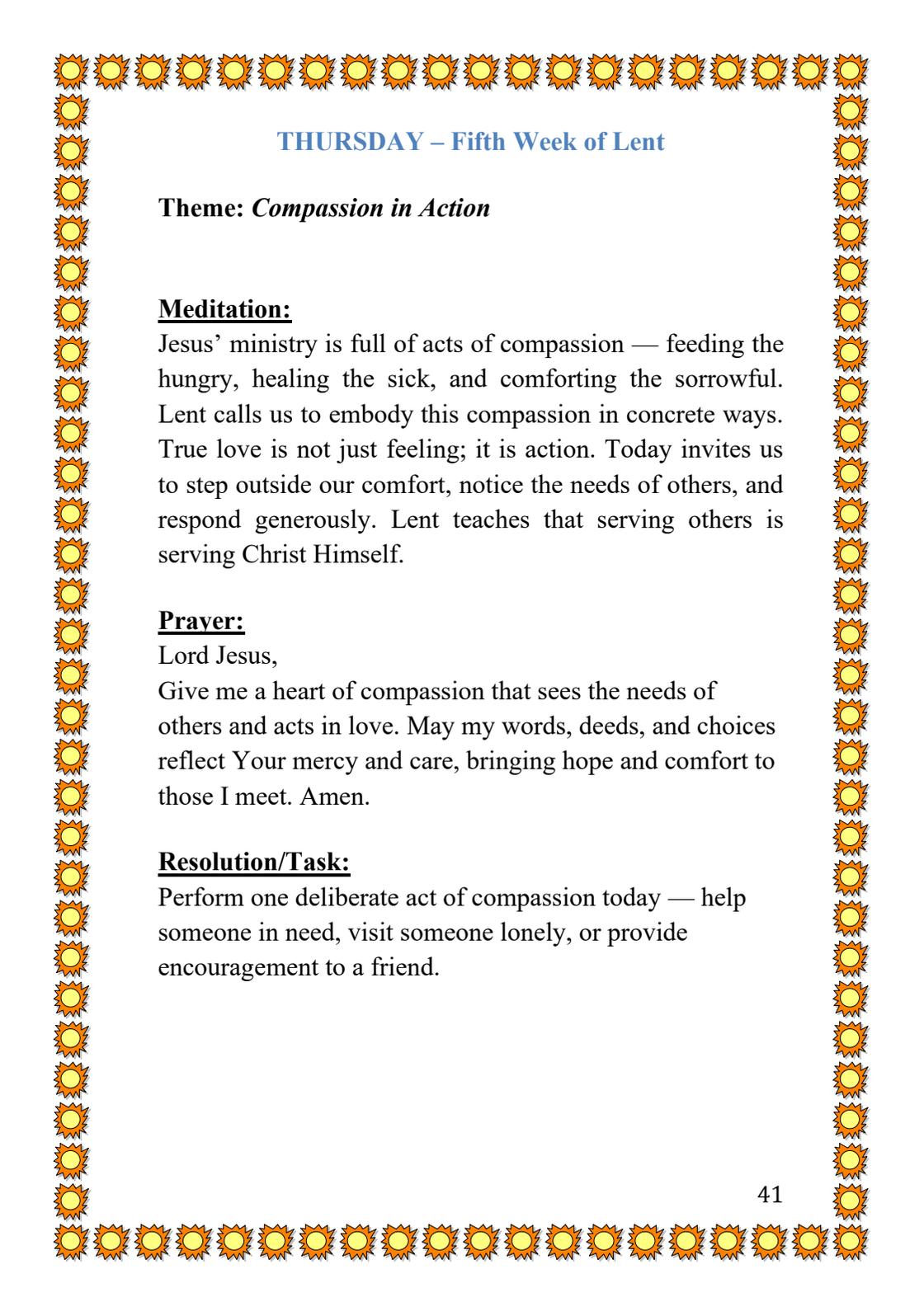

**Meditation:**

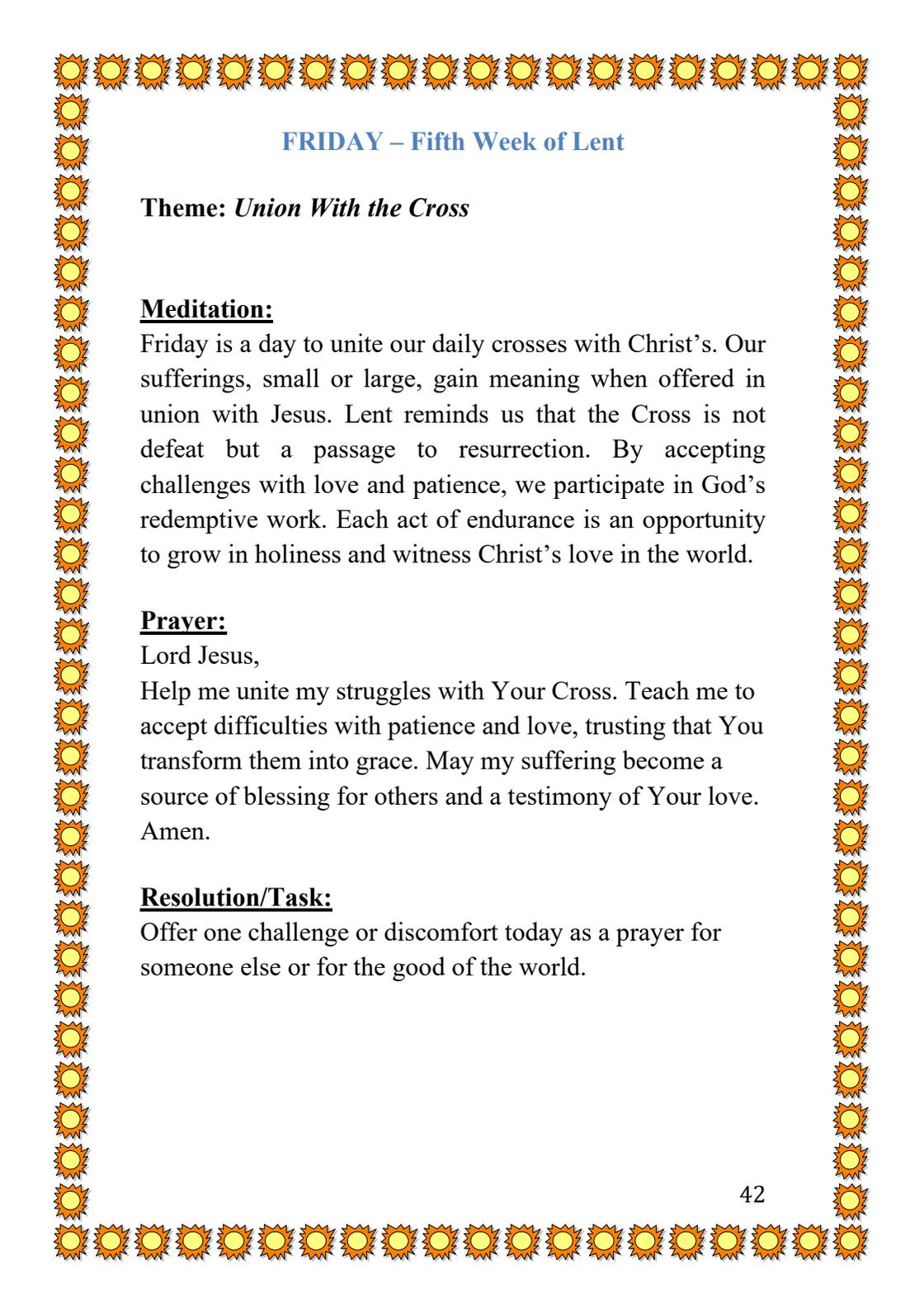

**Meditation:**

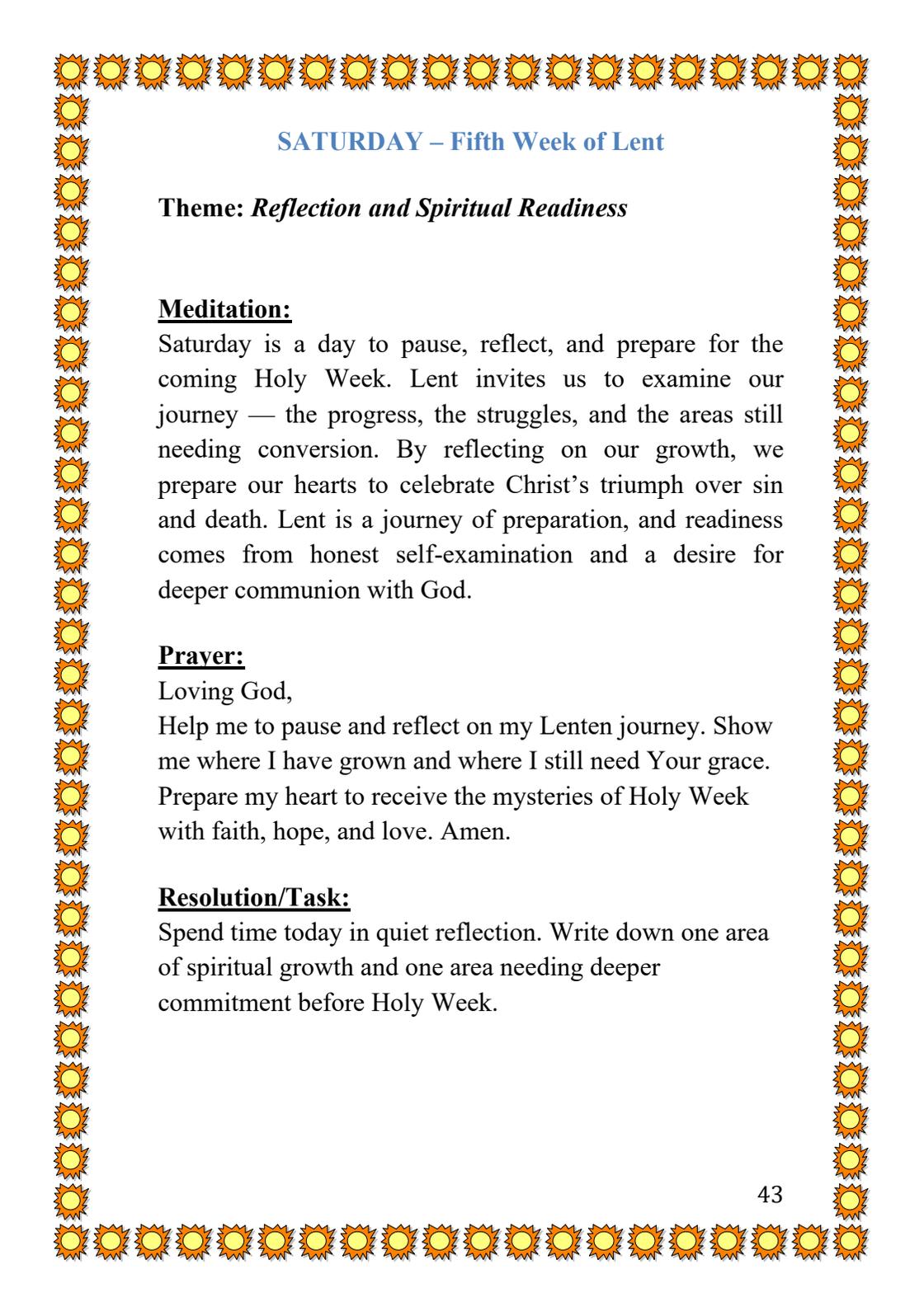

**Meditation:**

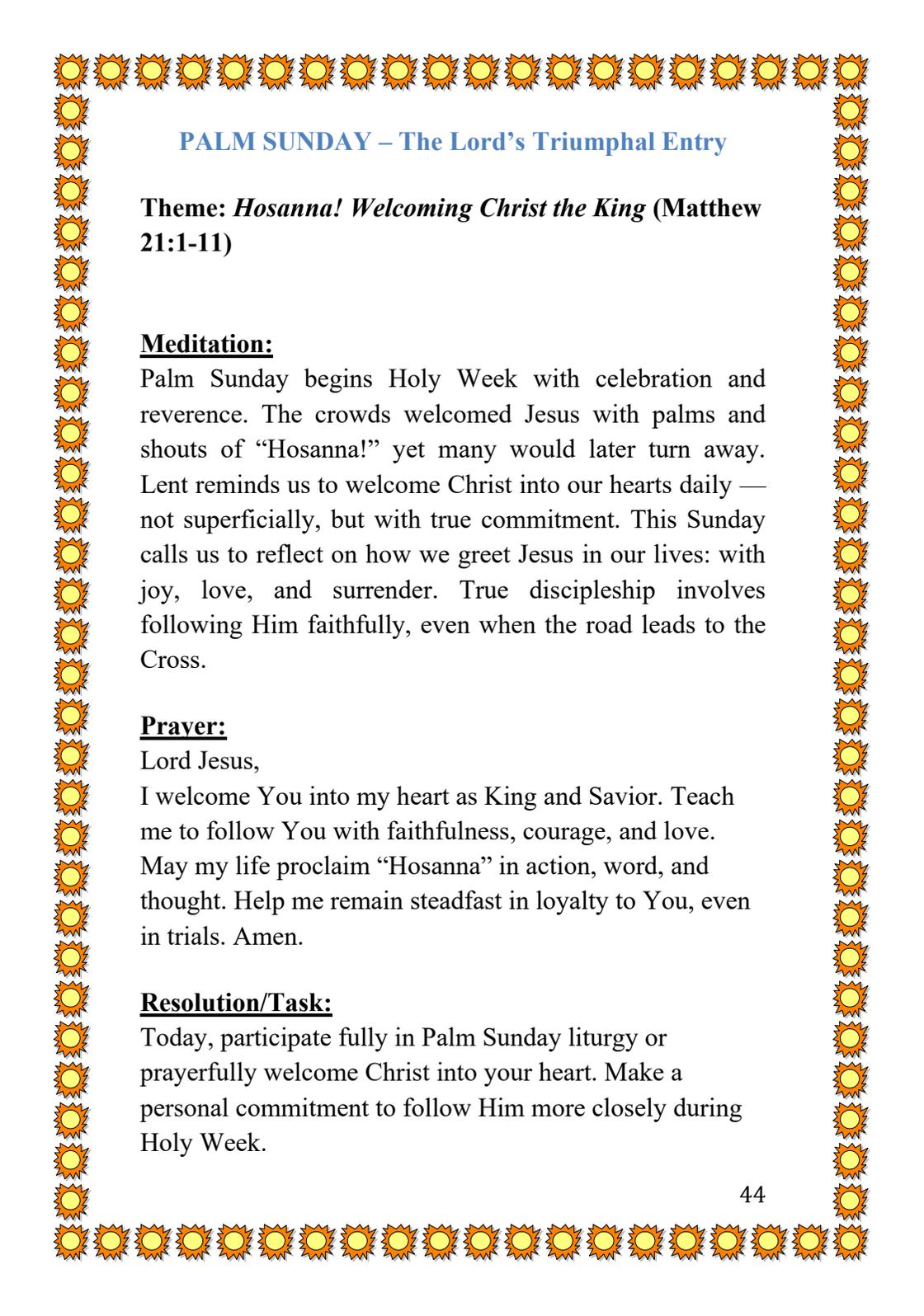

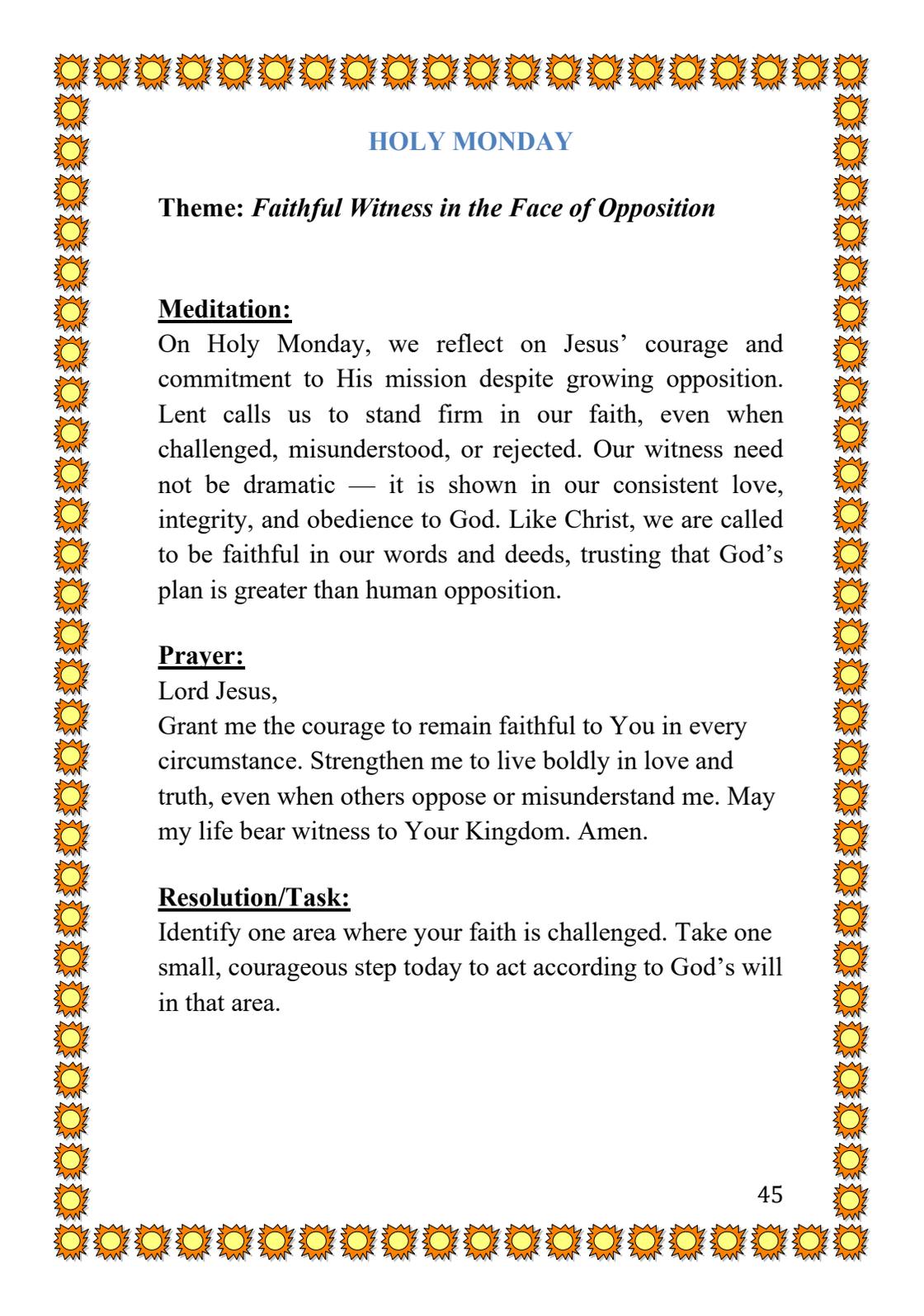
### **Prayer:**

**Meditation:**

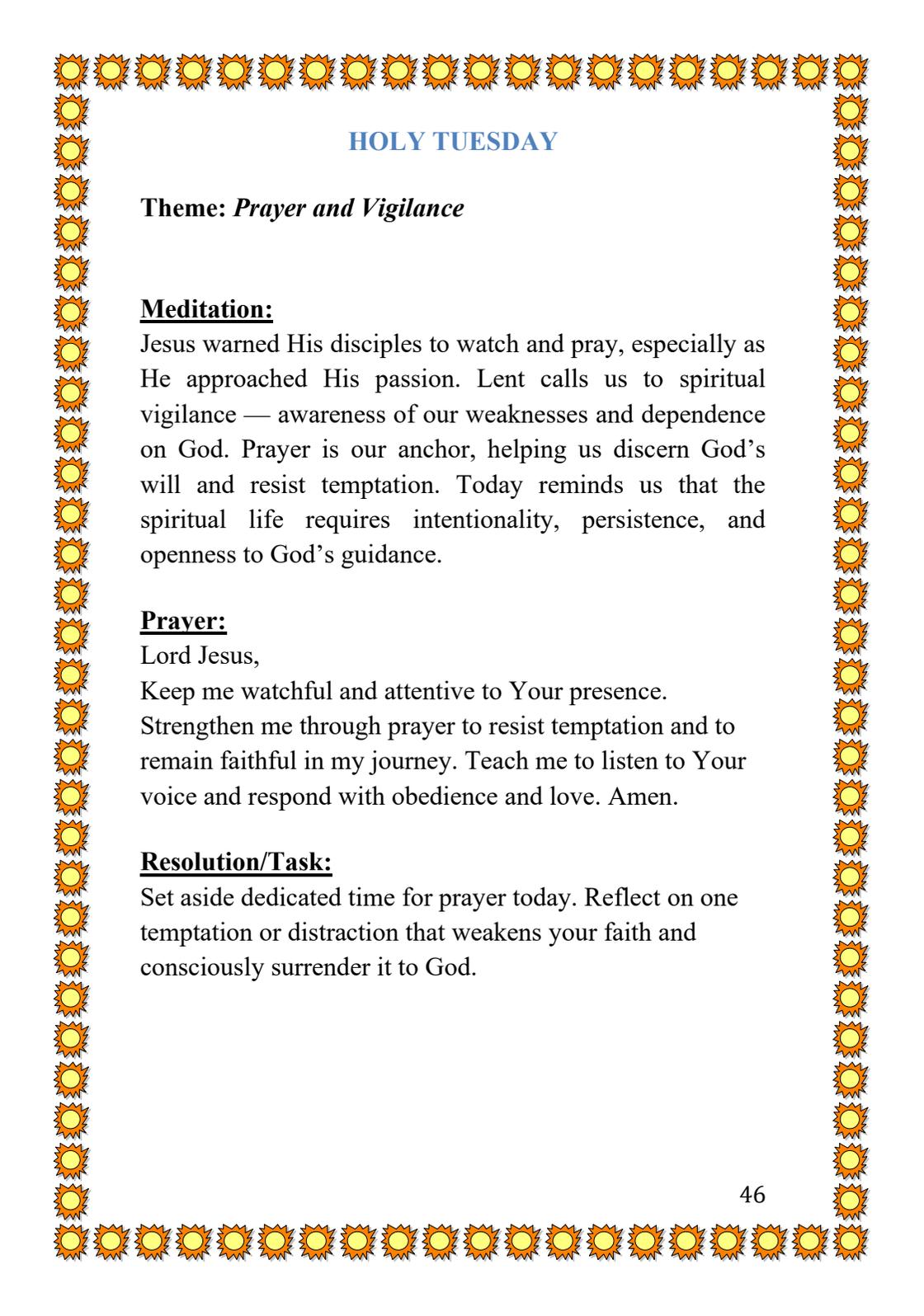

**Meditation:**

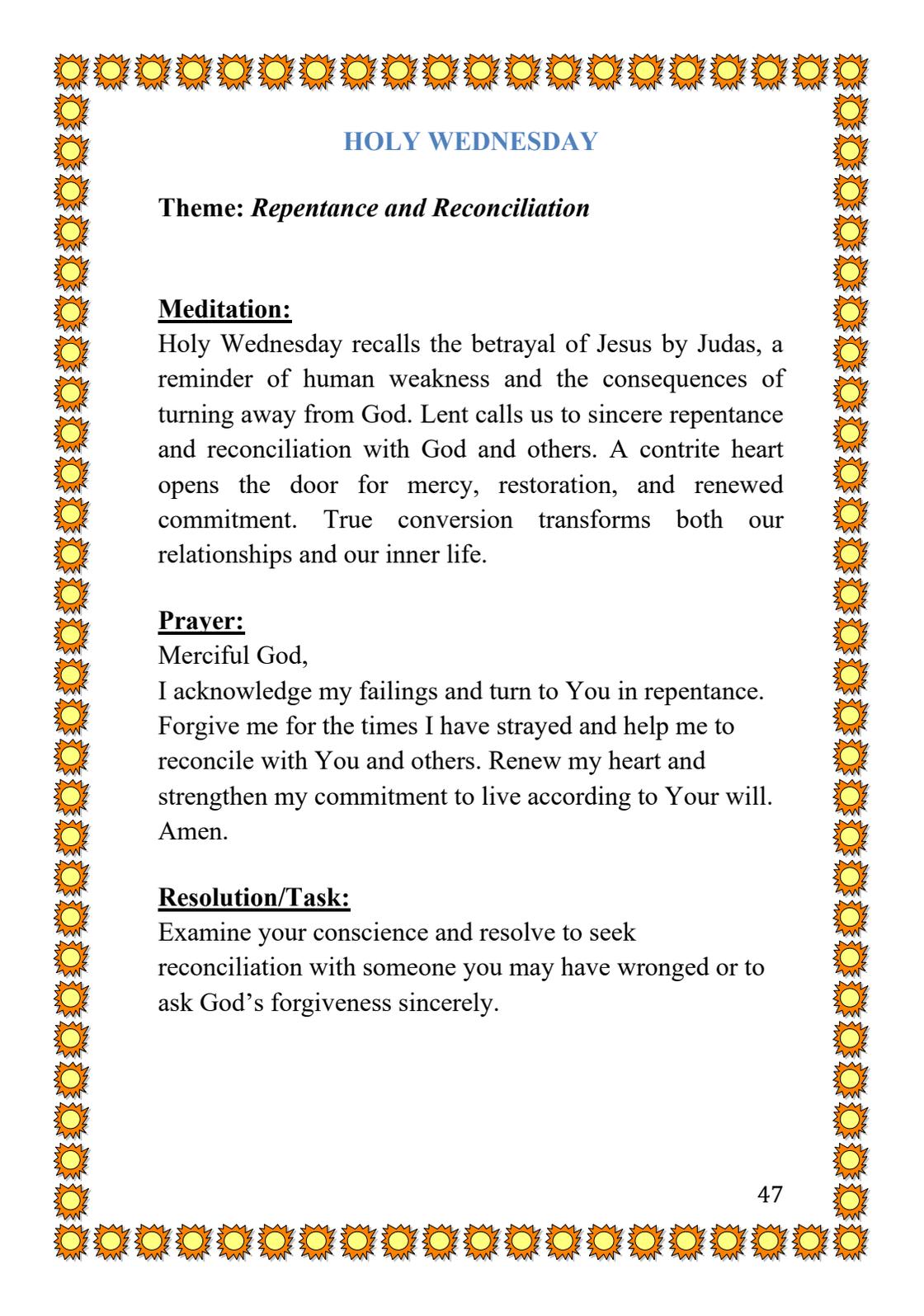

**Meditation:**

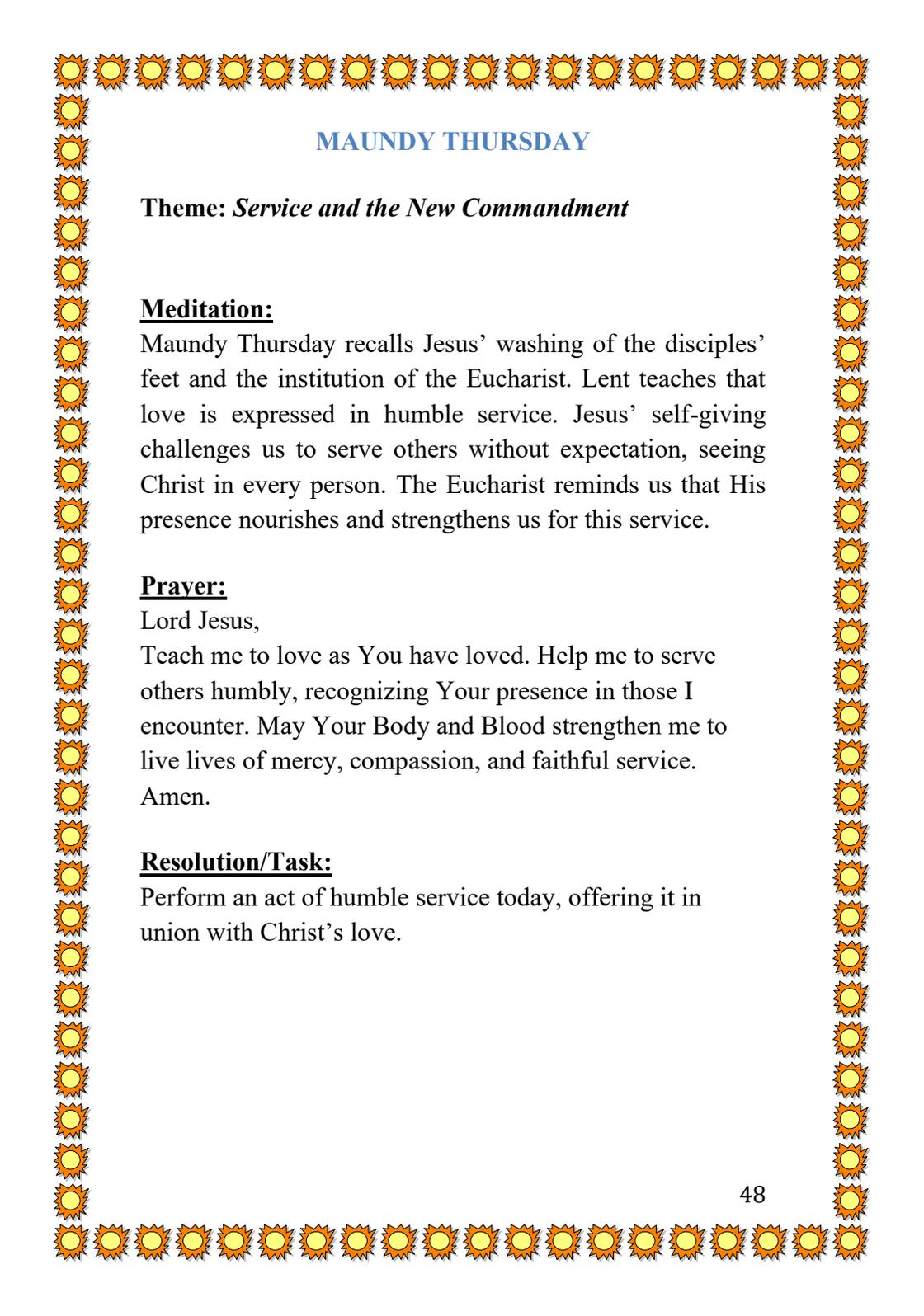

**Meditation:**

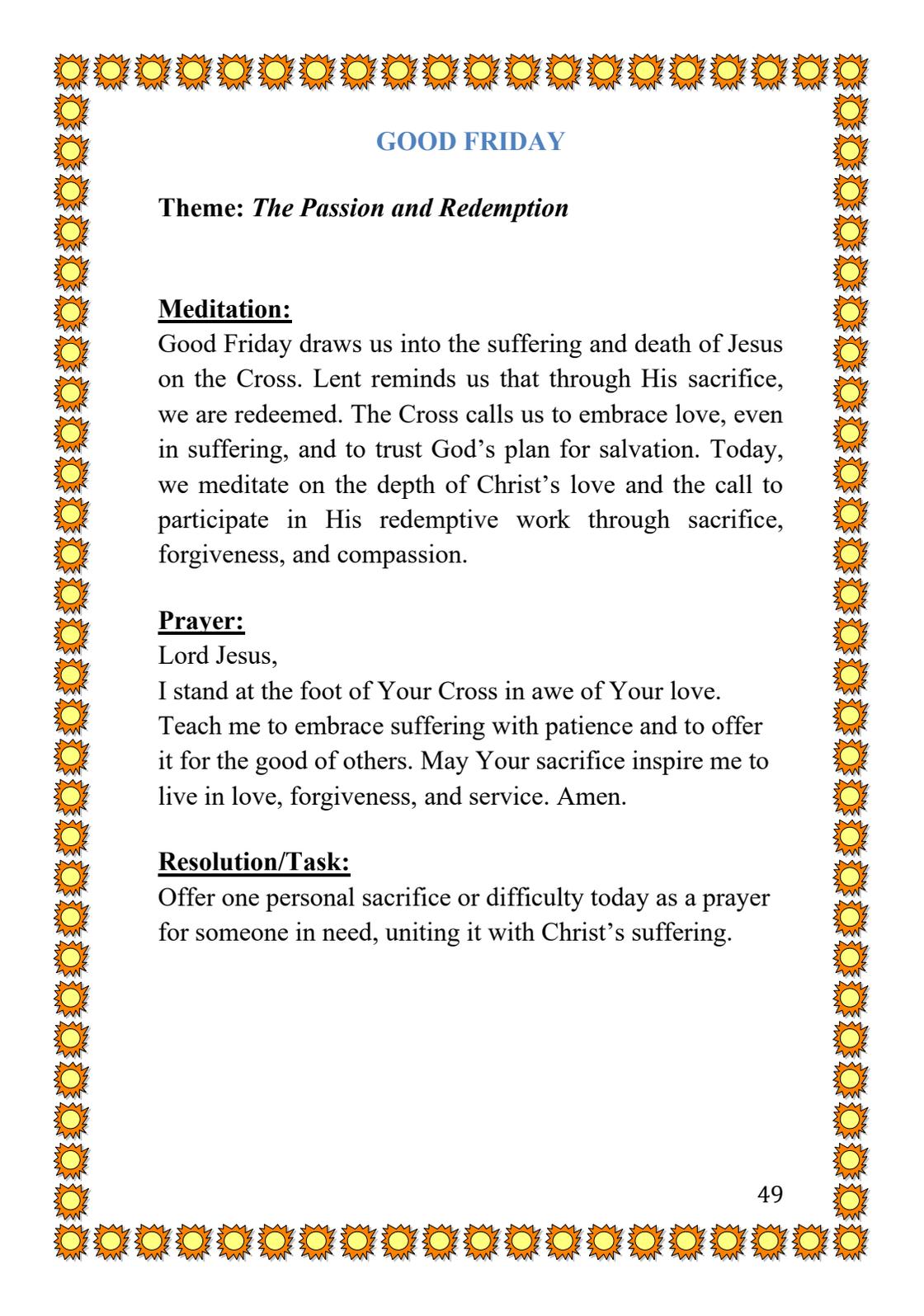

**Prayer:**

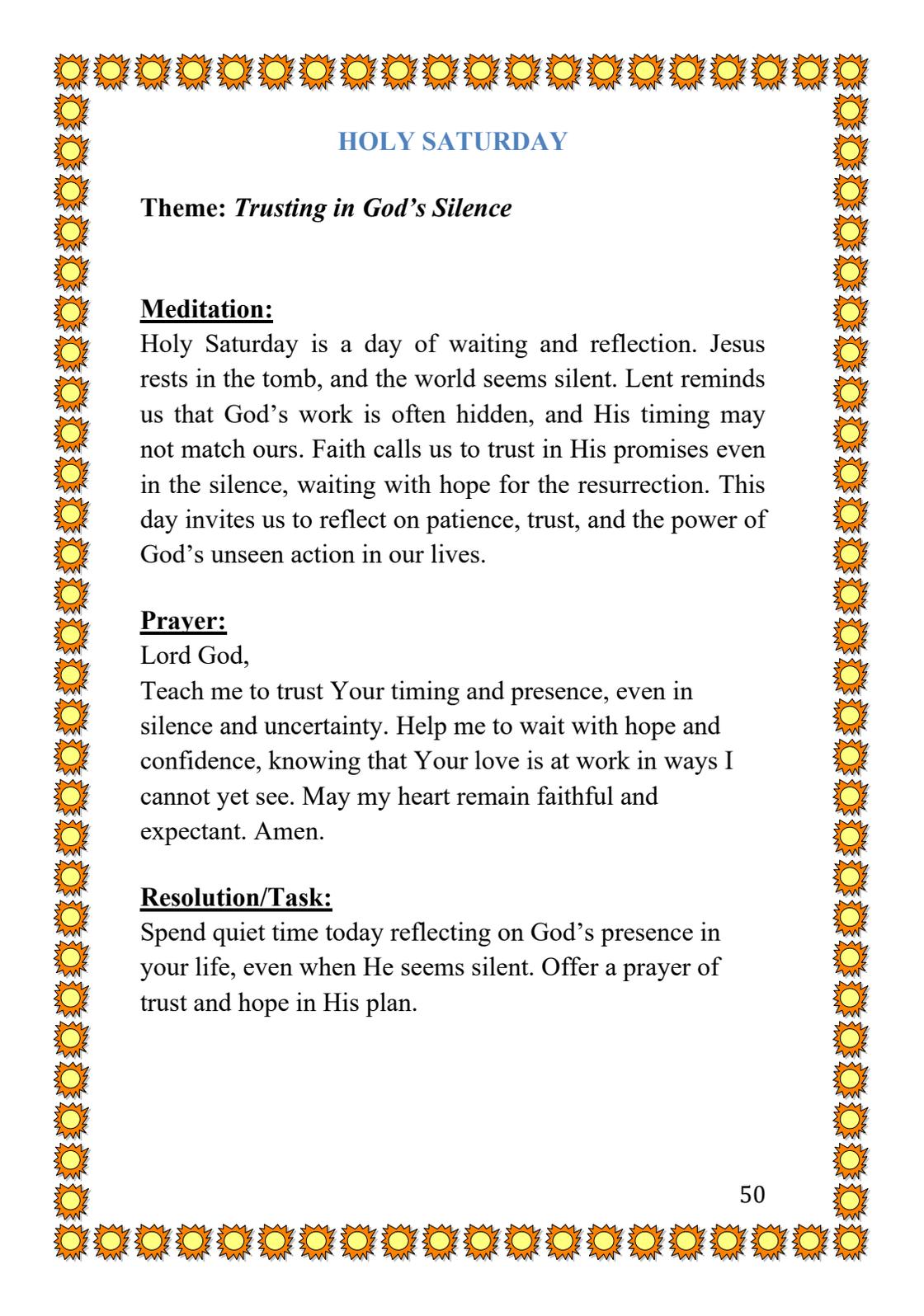
Lord Jesus,
